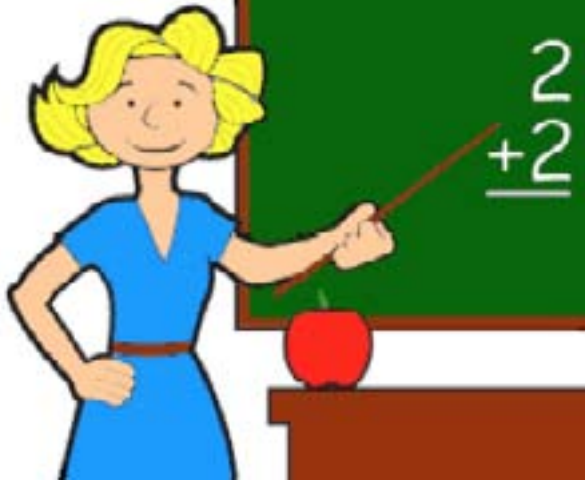

TRUTH ACCORDING TO US, by Annie Barrows. During the Depression Layla joins the Federal Writers' Project and is assigned to cover the history of a remote West Virginia mill town. She is drawn into the complex world of her hosts, the unconventional Romeyn family and discovers that the truth of the town is deeply entangled in the thorny past of the Romeyn dynasty.

THE RUMOR, by Elin Hilderbrand. Nantucket writer Madeline King, desperate to revive her career, has done the unthinkable. 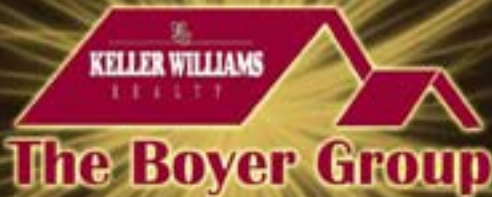
