For example; every watercraft, golf cart and ATV inside the gate must have a current sticker, children between the ages of 13 and 16 must have a permit to operate golf carts and ATV's without an adult and all jet skiing, wake boarding, tubing, etc. must stop 30 minutes before sunset. BOOK REVIEW LUNCHEON

FICTION

THE STRANGER, by Harlan Coben. Adam Price has the seemingly perfect life – until he learns a devastating secret about his wife, Corinne. When he confronts her, the mirage of perfection disappears. He has stumbled into a dark conspiracy and realizes if he doesn't make exactly the right moves, it will not only ruin their lives – it will end them.

HAUSFRAU, by Jill Alexander Essbaum. Anna, an American in her late 30s, lives a very comfortable life with her remote Swiss husband, a banker, and their three children, in a postcard-perfect Zurich suburb. But she is falling apart inside, her life spins out of control, and, crossing a moral threshold, she discovers where a woman goes when there is no going back. **AT THE WATER'S EDGE,** by Sara Gruen. To regain his wealthy father's favor (and inheritance), Ellis decides to succeed in the venture at which his father attempted and publicly failed: finding the Loch Ness monster. As he and his wife and a friend hunt the monster in Scotland, another monster, Hitler, is devastating Europe.

HUSH HUSH, by Laura Lippman. New parent and private detective Tess Monaghan is plunged into a disturbing case involving murder and a manipulative mother. She is hired to assess the security needs of a woman previously found not guilty by reason of criminal insanity in the death of her baby daughter. Twelfth in the series.

ORHAN'S INHERITANCE, by Aline Ohanesian. Orhan tries to find out why his Turkish grandfather left the family estate to a stranger thousands of miles away, an aging woman in an Armenian retirement home in Los Angeles. Moving back and forth between the last years of the Ottoman Empire and the 1990s, this is a story of passionate love, unspeakable horrors, and the hidden stories that can haunt a family for generations.

NON-FICTION

THIS IS THE STORY OF A HAPPY MARRIAGE, by Ann Patchett. The acclaimed author (Bel Canto, State of Wonder) examines her deepest commintments – to writitn, family, friends, dogs, books, and her husband. Streches from her childhood to the present day, bringing into focus the large experiences and small mements that have shaped here as a daugheter, wife, and writer. THE RESIDENCE: INSIDE THE PRIVATE WORLD OF THE WHITE HOUSE, by Sara Andersen Brower. 

Village Notes

Boating Season will soon be in full swing. With the operation of watercraft on our small and frequently congested lake comes the responsibility to to be safe, smart and follow the Texas and Lake Tanglewood boating rules. Following are a few of these rules (ref Code of Ordinances Sec. 8.01.011 and Texas Water Safety Act). The Code of Ordinances is available on the Lake Tanglewood Website.

- 1. Coast Guard approved **Personal Flotation Devices (PFD)** must be available for all occupants. Children under 13 years of age must wear a PFD. **Jet Ski operators and riders must wear a PFD.**
- 2. **Guests** may not operate a watercraft unless accompanied by a resident of the village.
- 3. All watercraft must have a current Lake Tanglewood Registration displayed on both sides of the boat.
- 4. Operators must be at least 13 years of age or accompanied by a person at least 18 years of age.
- 5. Maintain 50 ft. from all watercraft.
- 6. Operate in a **Counterclockwise Direction**, keeping the shore to the right.
- 7. **Must not cut across the lake** to jump waves from other boats.
- 8. Jet ski operators must attach an engine cutoff safety lanyard.
- 9. Observe all **No Wake Zones.** No towing of tubes in a No Wake Zone.
- 10. **Jet Ski Operating Hours** from 9:00 a.m. to one-half hour prior to sunset.
- 11. No jet ski Splash Tag.
- 12. It is unlawful to operate any aircraft to or from the waters of Lake Tanglewood.

The Lake Tanglewood Police Department will place a special emphasis on boating safety and boat registration. Violators will be ticketed.

Important Village Meeting, May 11 at 6:00PM in the Community Center. Although the agenda isn't complete, one topic will be **the future of Lake Tanglewood EMS.** Due to the potential community interest, we will hold this meeting in the Community Center.

As you are probably aware, our EMS (ambulance) and Fire Departments are staffed by volunteers. Because of the lengthy training and certification requirements, we have not been able to adequately staff our EMS. Additionally, Randall County contracted with BSA to provide 24/7 paid EMS service out of the DPS facility at the corner of Georgia and Hollywood Road. These factors resulted in a drastic reduction of responses by our EMS. At this meeting we will explore potential options (including eliminating EMS) to this challenge. We value your thoughts and suggestions.

Emergency Notifications (wild fires, severe weather, evacuation, etc.). In addition to television and radio, there are two other means we all should utilize to be alerted to an emergency. These are:

- 1. **Weather Radio**. Weather radios are inexpensive and provide a 24/7 alert to impending or actual emergencies. They are the primary (along with TV) local and national warning system. Weather radios can be purchased at Market Street and other United Supermarkets.
- 2. **Resolve to Be Ready Mass Notification** system is part of a Panhandle wide emergency notification system that can provide email, text or direct emergency messages. Additionally, the system provides the Lake Tanglewood mayor and Emergency Management Coordinator the ability to generate local emergency messages. The system is free to our residents. To register, log on to www.R2Beready.com, click the Residents section and follow the instructions.
