WE HAVE THE FIRST BOOK IN THE YOUNG ADULT SERIES DIVERGENT

FICTION

PERSONAL by Lee Child. Someone has taken a rifle shot at the president of France. Jack Reacher is called away from his life as a drifter to find the shooter, a man he had sent to prison.

SOMEWHERE SAFE WITH SOMEBODY GOOD by Jan Karon. Ms. Karon returns after a long hiatus with another Mitford story that offers to readers all the beloved, quirky characters.

INVISIBLE by James Patterson and David Ellis. Emmy Dockery takes leave from her job as an FBI researcher to find a link among hundreds of unsolved murder cases – one of which is her own sister.

THE CHILDREN ACT by Ian McEwan. Judge Fiona Maye must decide a case in her family court involving a 17-year-old boy who is refusing life-saving medical treatment for religious reasons.

EDGE OF ETERNITY by Ken Follett. Book Three of the Century Trilogy. It takes the five intertwined families (introduced in the first two books) through the 1960s and 1980s – a world we thought we knew but now will never seem the same again.

NON-FICTION

LAWRENCE IN ARABIA by Scott Anderson. War, deceit, imperial folly, and the making of the modern Middle East. Based on four years of intensive primary document research, it definitely overturns received wisdom on this period of history.

CAN'T WE TALK ABOUT SOMETHING MORE PLEASANT? by Roz Chast, a long-time cartoonist for the *New Yorker*. A memoir. It is the story of an only child watching her parents age well into their nineties. Her graphics provide a refreshing way to read a book about laughter, rage, love, and guilt.

AUDIO CDs

ANGELS WALKING by Karen Kingsbury. Baseball star Tyler Ames suffers a career-ending injury at the same time Sami, the love he left behind, moves on. Meanwhile, Virginia, with Alzheimer's, is confined to a retirement home. A team of angels takes on the mission to restore hope for all three. First in a new series.

DEATH OF A GOSSIP by M. C. Beaton. Loathsome Inspector Blair sends Cyril Sessions, a keen young police officer, to Lochdubh to monitor exactly what Constable Hamish Macbeth does every day. Macbeth hears about Blair's plan and is prepared to ensure that Cyril returns to headquarters with a full report. But Cyril is soon found dead, and Hamish is the prime suspect.

HEARTSTONE by Philip Margolin. Two brutal slayings have rocked a stunned city. But the murders are merely the nightmare's beginning, flinging open a Pandora's box of sordid secrets and dark revelations more deadly than the bloodlust that lives in the heart of a killer. Winner of the Edgar Award.

PRIVATE DOWN UNDER by James Patterson. A young Asian man, blood-soaked and bullet-ridden, staggers into the glittering launch party for Private's new Australian branch. What looks like a botched kidnapping turns out to be a whole lot more. Soon a horrific murder in the wealthy Eastern suburbs stretches the team to the limit.

100 YEARS OF SOLITUDE by Gabriel Garcia Marquez, Colombian Nobel laureate. The rise and fall of the mythical town of Macondo is reflected through the history of the Buendia family. One of the 20th century's most enduring works, it is a rich and beautiful chronicle of life, death, and the tragicomedy of humankind.

THE CRUELEST MONTH by Louise Penny. Death haunts an impromptu séance in Three Pines. It looks as if she died of fright – or maybe it was murder. Third in the series.

YOUNG ADULT

DIVERGENT by Veronica Roth. In dystopian Chicago, society is divided into five factions, each dedicated to the cultivation of a particular virtue. Tris Prior must decide to stay with her family or be who she really is.

PRIMARY

THE DAY THE CRAYONS QUIT by Drew Daywalt. Crayons have feelings, too, in this funny back-to-school story. Was highlighted at Barnes & Noble for the entire month of September.

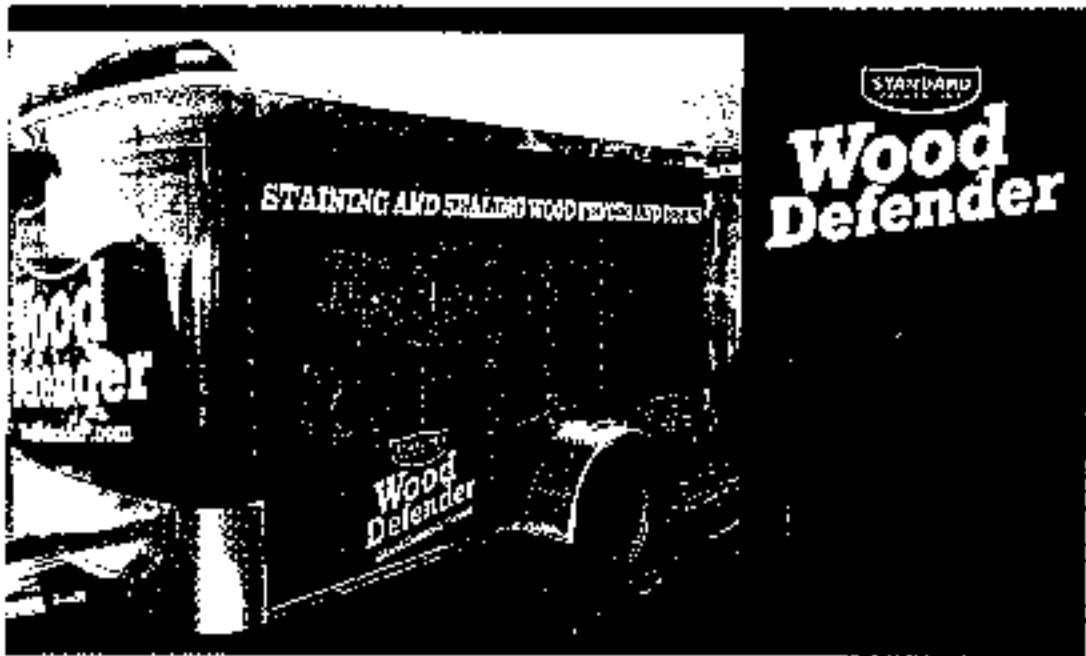
