Happy April to everyone. I hope all of you had a fun spring break! We are still working on nailing down bids to refurbish the park restrooms. In addition, we are working on plans for restructuring the gate entrance. Also the split rail fence on the North side of Tanglewood Dr. has been installed.

Don't forget to come join us for some delicious food at the Restaurant. We have a nice new look to our menu, and some of the prices have been adjusted to reflect the increase in cost of food and services incurred since the last menu change a couple of years ago. The daily specials are posted on Facebook (search Harbor Point) and the Sunday brunch is from 9am to 1pm every week.

The acknowledgement form that everyone completed when getting stickers helped to further confirm LSIOT as a non-profit HOA. Starting with the April statements, members will no longer be charged for sales tax on dues, newsletter, and stickers. This change is due in part to the effort of the past and present Board of Directors, as well as our Attorney and CPA. Our attorneys are working on preparing changes to the articles of incorporation of LSIOT to further more confirm us as a non-profit HOA; and at some point the membership will be asked to vote on accepting the changes to the articles. Items that fall under Lake Tanglewood Inc. will still be subject to sales tax (such as the Restaurant, Boat parking, green fees, and Marina rent).

Please observe and follow the rule regarding corporate easements found in the L.S.I.O.T. Rules and Regulations:

- H. 21.
- (1) Members, Children Living at Home and their respective guests shall not park any Vehicle or trailer, or otherwise obstruct any area on LSIOT, Inc. property or any area within ten (10) feet of any platted road on LSIOT, Inc. property, except on a temporary basis not to exceed 48 hours without prior written approval from LSIOT, Inc. Any personal property that is abandoned or allowed to remain on corporate property, or allowed to remain within ten (10) feet of any platted road on LSIOT, Inc. property, will, if not removed by the Member after proper notice and a reasonable period to cure, be removed by LSIOT, Inc. and the cost of such removal will be charged to the Member. Any damage to private property within the ten (10) area adjacent to platted roads on LSIOT, Inc. property caused by the LSIOT, Inc. maintenance department for any reason (e.g., removing abandoned property, repairing utility lines, snowplowing, etc.) will be the Member's responsibility and LSIOT, Inc. will not be liable for any such damage.

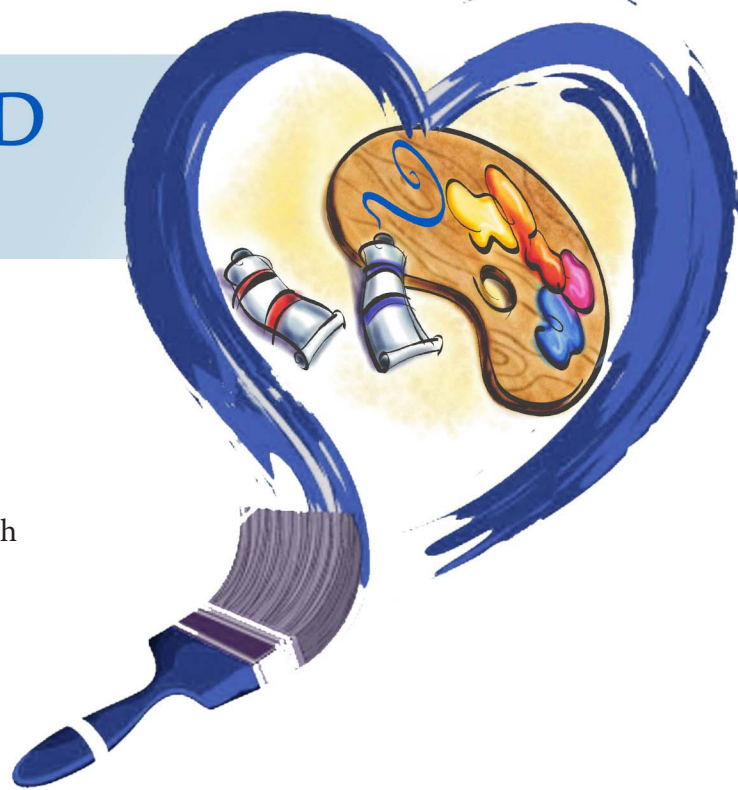

FICTION

BONE BOX (*Faye Kellerman*) Rina Lazarus makes a discovery in the woods. It leads her husband, detective Peter Decker, through a series of gruesome murders.

HEARTBREAK HOTEL (*Jonathan Kellerman*) Alex and Milo investigate the death of Alex's most mysterious patient to date. Thalia Mars is nearly 100 years old and has unsettling questions about guilt and patterns of criminal behavior. She promises to explain in their next session, but by that time she will be a homicide victim.

A PIECE OF THE WORLD (*Christina Baker Kline*) Christina Olson, increasingly incapacitated by illness, seemed destined for a small life in Maine. Instead, for 20 years she was the host and inspiration for artist Andrew Wyeth and became the subject of the well-known painting *Christina's World*. A powerful reimagining of her life and her complicated relationship with one of our greatest modern artists.

MURDER HOUSE (*James Patterson*) It has an ocean-front view, a private beach – and a deadly secret that won't stay buried. When a Hollywood power broker and his mistress are found dead in the abandoned house, what at first seems like an open-and-shut case turns out to have as many shocking secrets as the house itself. Detective Jenna Murphy risks her own life to expose the truth.

THE LIFE AND TIMES OF PERSIMMON WILLSON (*Nancy Peacock*) The epic journey of a slave-turned-Comanche warrior who travels from the brutality of a New Orleans sugar cane plantation to the Texas frontier, searching not only for the woman he loves, but also for his own identity.

NON FICTION

DREAMERS AND DECEIVERS (*Glenn Beck*) The popular, conservative radio and TV host offers true, previously untold stories of some of the heroes and villains who made America what it is today. From inventors like Lee de Forest and Steve Jobs to dreamers like Walt Disney, to con man Charles Ponzi, this is a fascinating exploration.

EVICTED: POVERTY AND PROFIT IN THE AMERICAN CITY (*Matthew Desmond*) Through both personal stories and data, Desmond proves that eviction undermines self, family, and community, bearing down disproportionately hard on women with children. In Milwaukee, being behind on rent gives landlords the opening to serve an eviction notice, which leads to a court date. On the face of it, it may seem easy to side with the landlords—of course tenants should pay their rent, but there's more to consider.

AROUND THE WORLD WITH AUNTIE MAME (*Patrick Dennis*) The sequel to *Auntie Mame* is narrated by Mame's fictional, deadpan nephew. It is first-rate, if not always first-class, voyage to intriguing locales around the world.

TULIP FEVER (*Deborah Moggach*) Love, money, and ambition combine in this passionate tale set in 1630's Amsterdam, where tulip mania reigns.

OUTFOXED (*David Rosenfelt*) Andy Carpenter's newest client took advantage of the county prison's dog training program for inmates to stage an escape.

HILLYBILL ELEGY (*J.D. Vance*) From a former marine and lawyer, a powerful account of growing up in a poor Rust Belt town that offers a broader probing look at the struggles of America's white working class.

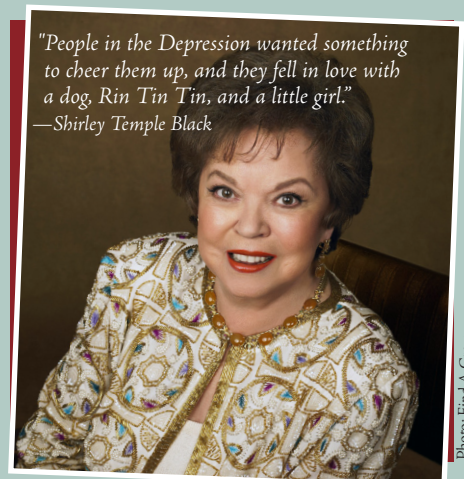

Shirley Temple Black was an American actress, singer, dancer, businesswoman and diplomat. She began her film career in 1932 at age 3 and was Hollywood's number one box-office star from 1935 to 1938.

She was the United States ambassador to Ghana and to Czechoslovakia. She also served as Chief of Protocol of the United States at the State Department.

Temple was the recipient of numerous awards and honors, including the Kennedy Center Honors and a Screen Actors Guild Life Achievement Award. She is 18th on the American Film Institute's list of the greatest female American screen legends of Classic Hollywood cinema.

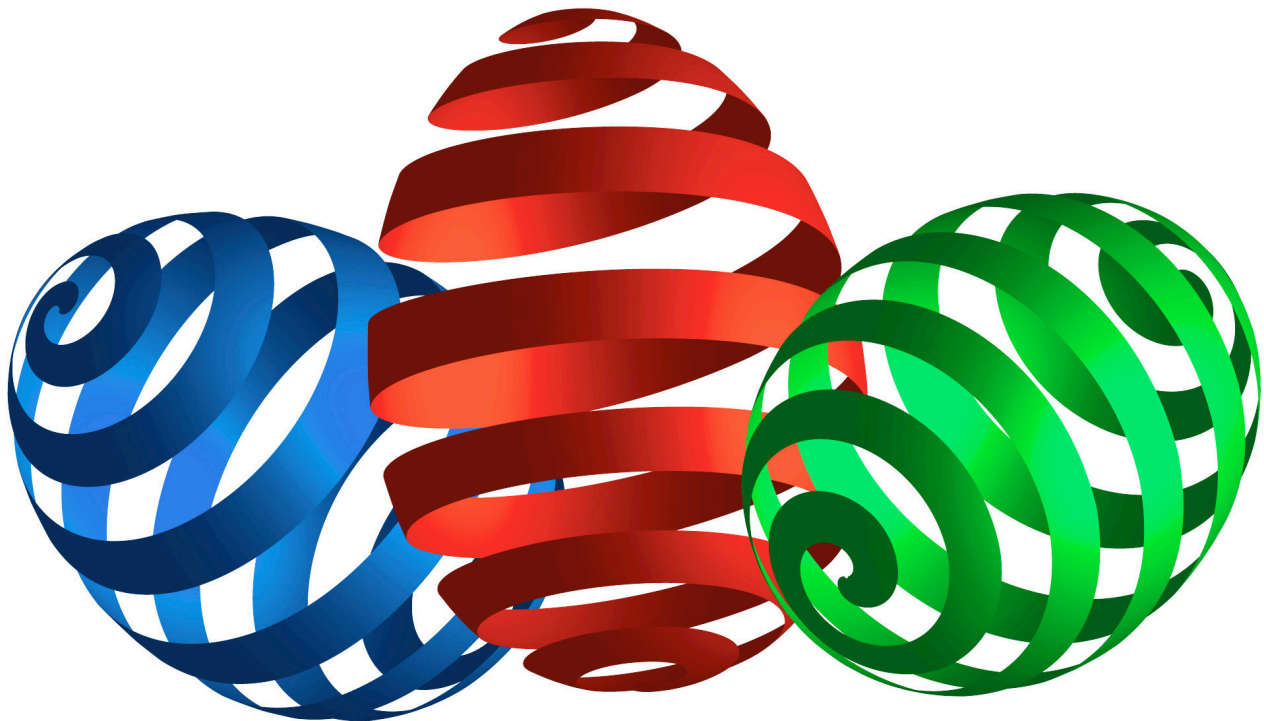

Easter

April is a special month. It is a month of warming temperatures, the beginning of spring flowers and a sign that summer is near. It is also the month when we celebrate that special holiday – Easter. What is Easter and why is it important?

Many of us have read the essay “One Solitary Life.” An essay about a man who was born into a poor carpenter’s family, worked as a carpenter until he was thirty and then became an itinerant preacher for three years. He never had material possessions, a family of his own or travelled far. He was beaten, went through a mockery of a trial and suffered the cruel death of being nailed to a cross. In the twenty centuries since His death we can see “that all the armies that ever marched; all the navies that were ever built; all the parliaments that ever sat and all the kings that ever reigned, put together, have not affected the life of man upon this earth as powerfully as has that one solitary life.” Why is that? The answer is the wonder, power and miracle of Easter.

That “One Solitary Life” was the life of Jesus. The miracle of Easter is a miracle we can all share. The miracle of Jesus’ death, burial and resurrection into Heaven.

First, we must recognize we (yes, you and me) have all sinned and fall short of the glory of God. (Romans 3:23)

Second, the only way of salvation is through faith in Jesus Christ. “I am the Way, the Truth, and the Life. No one comes to the Father except through me.” (John 14:6) “For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.” (Romans 6:23)

Third. To save us from the “wages of sin” and serve as an atonement for our (yours and my) sins, Jesus paid the ultimate price – his death on the cross. “God presented Him as a sacrifice of atonement” (Romans 3:25) “For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life. For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world through Him might be saved.” (John 3:16-17)

Fourth. Our salvation is a gift from God. Like all gifts, it becomes our gift only when we accept it. “It is by grace you have been saved, through faith-and this not from yourselves, it is a gift from God-not by works, so that no one can boast.” (Ephesians 2:8-9) Through the grace of God, we are offered the gift of salvation and eternal life in Heaven. All we have to do is accept that gift and believe.

Fifth. It is easy to accept the free gift God has given us through the sacrifice of His Son Jesus. “If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness.” (1John 1:9) “That if you confess with your mouth, “Jesus is Lord,” and you believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved. For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you confess and are saved.” (Romans 10:9-10)
