The Altar of Bones by Philip Carter - Thriller

"They didn't have to kill him....He never drank from the altar of bones." Cryptic dying words from a murdered homeless woman in present day San Francisco unlock a decades-buried secret that changed history. Now a pair of ruthless assassins are sent to cut the few living "loose ends" in a deadly game of cat and mouse, reaching across the globe from San Francisco-Paris-Budapest-Mongolia.

Assassin of Dreams by Ariel Barrington/Stone Vale - Thriller

Mildred Akins waved goodbye to her eldest son as he departed for school on that typical fall morning in 1944. Moments later, the local sheriff and his deputy arrived at her door, wrestled her into a strait jacket, gagged her with a stained handkerchief, drove her down the narrow, tree lined road that led to Lynball State Hospital for the criminally insane, and left her. State of Terror by Hillary Rodham Clinton/Louise Penny - Thriller/Political

The Turn of the Key by Ruth Ware - Thriller/Psychological

From the #1 New York Times bestselling author of The Lying Game and The Death of Mrs. Westaway comes this thrilling novel that explores the dark side of technology. Full of spellbinding menace and told in Ruth Ware's signature suspenseful style, The Turn of the Key is an unputdownable thriller from the Agatha Christie of our time.

Golden in Death by J.D. Robb - Mystery & Detective/Police Procedural - (50th book in the In Death series)

Homicide detective Eve Dallas investigates the springtime murder of a beloved pediatrician by an unknown killer who hid a deadly toxin inside of a small golden egg. But when someone else dies in the same grisly manner, it becomes clear that she's dealing with either a madman—or someone who has a hidden and elusive connection to both victims.
