Just a few words this month on golf etiquette and the results from our scrambles.

Golf Etiquette Tips

ARRIVE a little early and warm up those muscles in a safe place by doing some slow swings. Try to get loosened up to a full swing before you hit the tee box. How about rolling some putts? This will usually let you know how the ball will roll on the greens.

AVOID slow play. As much as I love taking my grandchildren to the golf course, I understand we will be slow. I watch for groups behind me and will let them play through. Don't take too much time looking for lost balls. If you suspect you've hit your shot out of bounds, you should hit a provisional ball. When you get to the area of the lost ball, you have 5 minutes to locate it. If it is not found within that time, play your provisional and take a stroke. Keep moving.

MAINTAIN THE COURSE.

If you take a divot on the tee box or the fairway, please take time to repair it. The tee box should have sand and seed mix, and in the fairway, replace the grass your club has damaged (it should be in front of you somewhere). On our greens, fix your ball marks and any that may be on your putting line. How well should you fix your ball marks? Answer: Good enough so you would putt through it.

FICTION

THE BURIAL HOUR (*Jeffery Deaver*) A traveling businessman is snatched off of an Upper East Side street in broad daylight. The perp leaves a token at the site: a miniature noose. When Lincoln Rhyme and Amelia Sachs investigate, they find a similar kidnapping occurred near Naples, Italy. The search for the killer will become a complex case of international cooperation where all is not as it seems.

THE CHALK ARTIST (Allegra Goodman) Collin James is young, creative, and unhappy. A college dropout, he waits tables and spends his free time beautifying the streets of Cambridge, Massachusetts, with his medium of choice: chalk. Collin's art captivates passersby with its vibrant colors and intricate lines—until the moment he wipes it all away. Nothing in Collin's life is meant to last. Then he meets Nina....

MAGPIE MURDERS (*Anthony Horwitz*) Bestselling crime writer Alan Conway's latest manuscript once again features his detective, Atticus Pund, who solves mysteries disturbing sleepy English villages. Conway's formula has proven so successful that editor, Susan Ryeland must continue to put up with his troubling behavior if she wants to keep her job. But the more Susan reads Conway's latest manuscript, the more she's convinced that there's another story hidden in the pages of the manuscript: one of real-life jealousy, greed, ruthless ambition, and murder.

MISSISSIPPI BLOOD (*Greg Iles*) Shattered by grief and dreaming of vengeance, Penn Cage sees his family and his world collapsing around him. The woman he loves is gone, his principles have been irrevocably compromised, and his father, once a paragon of the community that Penn leads as mayor, is about to be tried for the murder of a former lover. Most terrifying of all, Dr. Cage seems bent on self-destruction.

TWO BY TWO (*Nicholas Sparks*) Russell Green, 32, has a stunning wife, a lovable six year-old daughter, a successful career as an advertising executive, and an expansive home in Raleigh. But underneath the shiny surface of this perfect existence, fault lines are beginning to appear. In a matter of months, Russ finds himself without a job or wife, caring for his young daughter while struggling to adapt to a new and baffling reality.

THE FORCE (*Don Winslow*) Denny Malone is a highly decorated NYPD detective sergeant and the real leader of "Da Force." Malone and his crew are an elite special unit given carte blanche to fight gangs, drugs, and guns. But Malone is dirty: he and his partners have stolen millions of dollars in drugs and cash in the wake of the biggest heroin bust in the city's history. Now he's is caught in a trap and being squeezed by the Feds and must walk the thin line between betraying his brothers and partners, the Job, his family, and the woman he loves, while the city teeters on the brink of a racial conflagration that could destroy them all.

IN THIS GRAVE HOUR (*Jacqueline Winspear*) It's been a year since Maisie's dangerous mission inside Nazi Germany, where she encountered an old enemy and the Fuhrer himself. Maisie is back home in England, yet neither she nor her nation is safe. Britain has just declared war on Germany and is mobilizing for the devastating battle ahead. But when she stumbles on the deaths of a group of refugees, Maisie suspects the enemy may be closer than anyone knows.

NON-FICTION

HUE 1968 (*Mark Bowden*) In the early hours of January 31, 1968, the North Vietnamese launched over one hundred attacks across South Vietnam in what would become known as the Tet Offensive. The lynchpin of Tet was the capture of Hue, Vietnam's intellectual and cultural capital, by 10,000 National Liberation Front troops who descended from hidden camps and surged across the city of 140,000. Within hours the entire city was in their hands save for two small military outposts. American commanders refused to believe the size and scope of the Fronts presence, ordering small companies of marines against thousands of entrenched enemy troops. After several futile and deadly days, Lieutenant Colonel Ernie Cheatham would finally come up with a strategy to retake the city, block by block and building by building, in some of the most intense urban combat since World War II.

ASTROPHYSICS FOR PEOPLE IN A HURRY (*Neil DeGrasse Tyson*) What is the nature of space and time? How do we fit within the universe? How does the universe fit within us? The acclaimed astrophysicist and bestselling author brings the universe down to Earth. He succinctly and clearly reveals what you need to be fluent and ready for the next cosmic headlines: from the Big Bang to black holes, from quarks to quantum mechanics, and from the search for planets to the search for life in the universe.

MYTHOLOGY (*Edith Hamilton*) What is the nature of space and time? How do we fit within the universe? How does the universe fit within us? CHURCHILL'S MINISTRY OF UNGENTLEMANLY WARFARE (Giles Milton) In the spring of 1939, a top-secret organization was founded in London: its purpose was to plot the destruction of Hitler's war machine through spectacular acts of sabotage. The guerrilla campaign that followed was every bit as extraordinary as the six men who directed it. One of them, Cecil Clarke, was a maverick engineer who had spent the 1930s inventing futuristic caravans. Now, his talents were put to more devious use: he built the dirty bomb used to assassinate Hitler's favorite, Reinhard Heydrich. Another, William Fairbairn, was a portly pensioner with an unusual passion: he was the world's leading expert in silent killing, hired to train the guerrillas being parachuted behind enemy lines. Led by dapper Scotsman Colin Gubbins, these men—along with three others—formed a secret inner circle that, aided by a group of formidable ladies, single-handedly changed the course Second World War: a cohort hand-picked by Winston Churchill, whom he called his Ministry of Ungentlemanly Warfare.

WRITER, SAILOR, SOLIDER, SPY: ERNEST HEMINGWAY'S SECRET

ADVENTURES, 1935–1961 (*Nicholas Reynolds*) In 2010, while he was the historian at the esteemed CIA Museum, Nicholas Reynolds, a longtime American intelligence officer, former U.S. Marine colonel, and Oxford-trained historian, began to uncover clues suggesting Nobel Prize-winning novelist Ernest Hemingway was deeply involved in mid-twentieth-century spy craft— a mysterious and shocking relationship that was far more complex, sustained, and fraught with risks than has ever been previously supposed. Now Reynolds's meticulously researched and captivating narrative, *Writer*, *Sailor*, *Soldier*, *Spy*, "looks among the shadows and finds a Hemingway not seen before" revealing for the first time the whole story of this hidden side of Hemingway's life: his troubling recruitment by Soviet spies to work with the NKVD, the forerunner to the KGB, followed in short order by a complex set of secret relationships with American agencies, including the FBI, the Department of State, the Office of Naval Intelligence (ONI), and the Office of Strategic Services (OSS), a precursor to the CIA.

BIOGRAPHY

NEVERTHELESS (*Alec Baldwin*) Over the past three decades, Baldwin has established himself as one of Hollywood's most gifted, hilarious, and controversial leading men. From his work in popular movies including *Beetlejuice* and *The Departed* to his award-winning role as Jack Donaghy on *30 Rock*, he's both a household name and a deeply respected actor. In this honest and affecting memoir, Baldwin transcends his public persona, revealing facets of his life he has long kept private.

AUDIO

CAMINO ISLAND (*John Grisham*) A gang of thieves stages a daring heist from Princeton University's Firestone Library. The loot is priceless—manuscripts by F. Scott Fitzgerald. Bruce Cable owns a popular bookstore on Camino Island, but makes his real money as a dealer in rare books, occasionally dabbling in the black market. And a young novelist, Mercer Mann, is hired to get close to Cable. Result: Trouble in paradise.

TAKEN BY STORM (*Tami Hoag*) Julia is furious when Storm vows he's going to marry her! This handsome guy has broken her heart more than once, and she has no intention of letting him walk out on her again. But as far as he's concerned, she's the only woman for him. He must convince her that she belongs in his life forever.

TORNADO WARINING (*Deborah Kennedy*) When five-year-old Daisy Gonzalez goes missing, nearly everyone in town suspects or knows something different about what happened. And they know a lot about each other. The immigrants who work in the dairy farm know their employers' secrets. The hairdresser knows everything except what's happening in her own backyard. And the roadkill collector knows love and heartbreak more than anyone would ever expect. They are all connected in ways small and profound, open and secret.

FRONTIER GRIT (*Marianne Monson*) The unlikely, true stories of 12 daring pioneer women—selfless providers, courageous immigrants and migrants, crusaders for social justice—who heard the call to settle the American West and came from all points of the globe to begin their journey.

FIRST STAR I SEE TONIGHT (Susan Elizabeth Phillips) Piper Dove dreams of becoming the best detective in Chicago. First job? Trail former Chicago Stars quarterback Cooper Graham. Problem? Graham's spotted her, and he's not happy. From the bustling streets of Chicago to a lighthouse on Lake Superior to the waters of Biscayne Bay, two people who can't stand to lose will test themselves, and each other, to discover what matters most.

Emergency Management Notes

As you have probably guessed, the **siren project** has fallen significantly behind schedule. Slow bureaucratic administration gets in the way of progress. The good news is administrative progress should start up this week and the sirens should be in place (hopefully) by the end of September.

Most, if not all of you are probably aware we have **three commercial pipelines** passing through our village and under the lake. One is a 10 inch, high pressure natural gas pipeline and the other two are 8 inch and 12 inch crude petroleum pipelines. We are tentatively planning a multiagency **oil pipeline spill exercise on Wednesday, October 11**th. The major portion of the exercise will be table top (conducted in the command center) and invisible to residents. We will, however exercise some of our village emergency actions including opening a shelter and emergency exits, simulated road closures, closing (briefly) boat ramps and establishing a first responder staging area. You may witness some of these actions, but they should have minimal (if any) impact on normal activities.

Volunteer Emergency Management Coordinator being recruited. Having served as the village Emergency Management Coordinator since the fall of 2010, I am ready to give the stick (flying term) to someone else. My replacement will officially take over November 1st. Although the primary requirement for the position is a willingness to serve, I will share a few thoughts.

Recognizing there is always room to grow and improve a program, I believe we are in a good position when viewed in the context of our village and its resources. There is a pretty good Emergency Management Program in place. My replacement will be required to complete a number of very short and easy online FEMA required courses and two classes (five days total) offered annually in Amarillo or a nearby community. Although there are no specific position requirements, crises management, command post, disaster planning/execution or other related experience will be beneficial.

You will also have the opportunity to meet, work with and learn from the emergency management community within the twenty-six counties of the Panhandle. We have excellent relationships with the Amarillo Office of Emergency Management (OEM), Panhandle Regional Planning Commission emergency

planners, National Weather Service, the Panhandle emergency management community and the local Texas Department of Emergency Management (DPS) officer.

Since taking over this position in 2010, most of my time has been spent learning, coordinating with and working with other members of the emergency management community and developing our plans and program. The only real world incident during those years was the wildfire in February of 2011. During the very heavy rains over Memorial Day Weekend a couple of years ago, I continually monitored the lake level and sent updates to Amarillo OEM and Palo Duro Canyon State Park. Prior to a forecast severe ice storm we prepared one of our shelters to be activated. We want to be prepared for contingencies we hope don't occur.

Emergency Management

Many of the newer residents to our community are unaware that we have one primary and three emergency exits from our village. These exits are there should we need them in an emergency such as a wildfire, major structural fire, gas leak, big bridge being closed or other incident. The 100 South Shore emergency exit is also an emergency exit for the Palisades and is used by the Palisades when their low water crossing is flooded.

Although these gates are kept locked, there are keys in the police, fire department and maintenance vehicles. The fire department frequently uses these gates when responding on mutual aid calls.

Should there be a need to use one or more emergency exits, the village and L.S.I.O.T. will utilize every means at our disposal to notify you. These include email, the PARIS text and email alert system, emergency personnel directing traffic and the weather radio. The emergency exits are depicted on the map and are:

Primary Exit: Main Gate


#1: South Shore to the loop, bear right on Cedar Lane (one lane and narrow). Cedar Lane turns into Frog Leap and exits to The Canyons at Currie Ridge subdivision.

#2: Follow North Shore to approximately 614 North Shore. Bear left on to the private driveway (Canyon Rim) (narrow twisting driveway). This will put you on John's Way in River Falls.

#3: Follow South Shore to the end (100 South Shore). This gate leads into the Palisades.

Yes, we are still going to have **warning sirens** at the lake. Unfortunately, there is a shipping delay with some of the components. This will probably delay completion of the project until late July or August.
