Dear Members:

With a deadline of the 20th of the month for this, I'm not able to report the outcomes from the Annual Meeting that was held on January 28th. So, please do not hesitate to contact the office if you have any questions concerning that meeting.

The Corporation continues to move forward with the Village to provide police coverage of the roads and water. We should be reviewing drafts of a new agreement by the time you get this.

Stickers have been issued under the new rules with only a few minor hiccups. This year the Board set a limit of 3 powered boats and 3 personal watercraft (jet skis, etc) per membership. For 2017, those limits will be reduced to 2 powered boats and 2 personal watercraft per membership. If you have more than that, you should begin to make plans on what to do. Unstickered watercraft inside the gate will be a rules violation, subject to fines and/or suspension of privileges. The intent is to control the pressure on the lake and to provide a safer environment for members and guests.

If you follow the run to the Oscars, personal favorites include: Mad Max, Star Wars, Spotlight, Joy, Bridge of Spies, The Big Short, The Revenant and The Martian. Concussion was not nominated, but is really good.

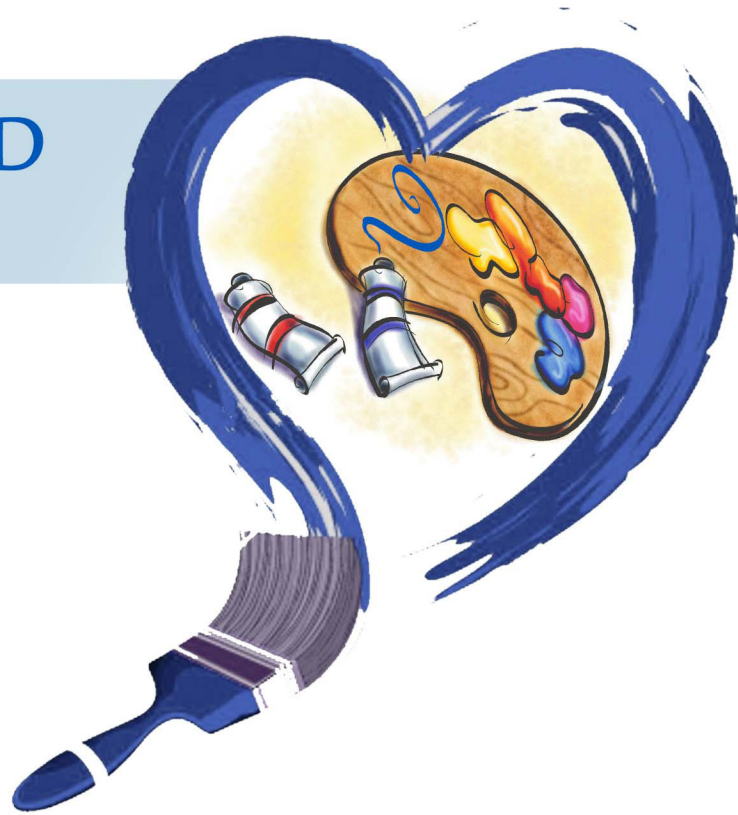

## **Hazard Warning**

The Montana State Department of Fish and Wildlife is advising golfers to take extra precautions and be on the alert for bears while playing National Forests golf courses.

They advise golfers to wear noise-producing devices such as little bells on their clothing to alert, but not startle the bears unexpectedly. They also advise you to carry pepper spray in case of an encounter with a bear.

It is also a good idea to watch for signs of bear activity.

Golfers should be able to recognize the difference between black bear and grizzly bear droppings on the golf course.

Black bear droppings are smaller and contain berries and possibly squirrel fur. Grizzly bear droppings have bells in them and smell like pepper spray.

#### **FICTION**

**THE JAPANESE LOVER**, by Isabel Allende. Irina, a care worker with a troubled past, meets elderly Alma and her grandson, Seth, at a San Francisco nursing home. Irina and Seth are intrigued by a series of mysterious gifts and letters sent to Alma, and eventually uncover an extraordinary, secret passion that has endured for nearly 70 years.

**GUEST ROOM**, by Chris Bohjalian. When Richard Chapman offers to host his younger brother's bachelor party, he does not expect bacchanalian drunkenness, a dangerously intimate moment in his guest bedroom, and two naked women stabbing and killing their Russian bodyguards before driving off into the night.

## Village Notes

If it has not yet started, you will soon see work on the **playground renovation project**. The Lions Club and community volunteers have put in a lot of effort on the project. Weather permitting, the project should be complete by late spring.

Although El Nino brought us increased rainfall in 2015, our winter has so far been rather dry. All of the moisture last year resulted in healthy plant growth for our yards and gardens, farms and natural areas. A downside of healthy plant growth is the **risk of wildfires**. The dry weather and today's (Jan 19<sup>th</sup>) wind provided the right combination for a dangerous wild fire in southern Randall County. This rapidly moving fire and a couple of small fires were fought by Randall County, three other fire departments and the Texas Forest Service. We may be thinking winter, but the tragic fires in 2011 were February 28<sup>th</sup>.

This is a good time for Lake Tanglewood **residents to start taking mitigating actions on their properties**. These actions should include cleaning out rain gutters, maintaining a clear zone around structures, clearing dead (not seasonally dormant) brush, clearing brush and debris under decks and trimming tree limbs over hanging or close to structures. If you are going to replace your roof use a fire resistant material, not cedar shingles.

The village and LSLOT have been working to resolve the **police department** contract issues. The old contract has been extended as an interim measure and a new contract is under legal review.
