Thank you to all of the members who took time to attend the L.S.I.O.T. town hall meetings and the annual meeting. Your participation and input was much appreciated. Most of all thank you for voting. The voting results are as follows:

The dues increase passed with 217 for and 76 against.

The dues increase of \$58.50 includes the following components: \$21 for L.S.I.O.T. operations, \$21 to fund five-year plan(the \$21 for the five year plan will be in a "sunset fund" that will expire in five years), and \$16.50 to fund village operations. \$42 of the dues increase for L.S.I.O.T. will go into effect March 1, 2017. \$16.50 for the village will go into effect October 1, 2017 .

Kelvin Betzen and Gary Schneck were voted in to fill the two open positions for the Board of Directors.

Thank you to the two outgoing board members Wales Madden III, and Gary Fletcher. These gentlemen have put in a lot of hours, often behind the scenes, to make this community a better place. Among other things, they both were instrumental in making needed changes to the by-laws, rules and regulations, and restructured how our financials are handled.

Notice: Rules and Regulations change - **Pg. 4 D. COMBINING MEMBERSHIPS**
As of January 5, 2017 (By vote of the Board of Directors), any Member who owns two or more adjacent Lots will not be allowed to combine the lots under one Membership. No prior relinquishments of Memberships may be reversed. This rule does not prohibit a Member from a subsequent partial transfer of the property as described in Section I.C.3. above.

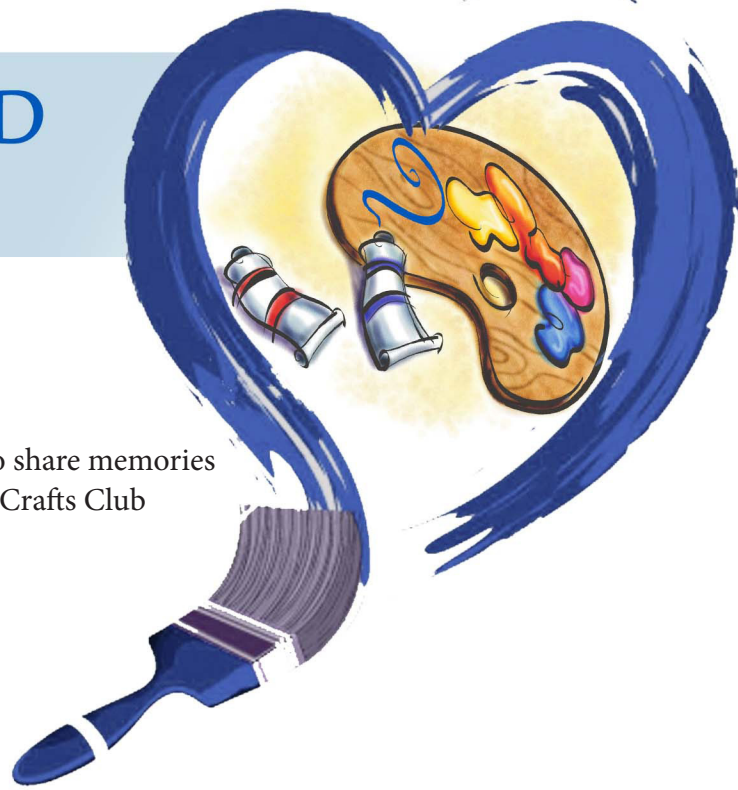

FICTION

CHAOS (*Patricia Cornwell*) When a young woman is killed while riding her bicycle, forensics expert Dr. Kay Scarpetta decides it was no accident. She suspects the death is related to a flurry of bizarre poems she starts receiving from an anonymous cyberbully. And the venomous media is not helping matters.

HERE I AM (*Jonathan Safran Foer*) In Washington, D.C., a Jewish couple and their three are forced to confront the distances between the lives they think they want and the lives they are living. Then a catastrophic earthquake sets in motion an escalating conflict in the Middle East.

THE ORPHAN MOTHER (*Robert Hicks*) Following the Civil War, Mariah Reddick, former slave to Carrie McGavock (*The Widow of the South*), built a new life as a midwife in Tennessee. When her politically-minded son, Theopolis, is murdered, she finds her world once more breaking apart. Who wanted him dead?

THE CHEMIST (*Stephanie Meyer*) An ex-agent who knows too much is on the run from her employers. She must take one more case to clear her name and save her life. As she sees her choices rapidly disappearing, she must apply her unique talents in ways she never dreamed of.

NON FICTION

FILTHY RICH (*James Patterson*) Jeffrey Epstein's rise from humble origins to the top of New York City's financial elite was marked by a desire for more and more – and his taste for young girls eventually resulted in his stunning fall from grace.

HIDDEN FIGURES (*Margot Lee Shetterly*) The true story of the black female mathematicians whose calculations helped fuel some of America's greatest achievements in space. Before John Glenn orbited the earth or Neil Armstrong walked on the moon, these dedicated women, known as human computers, used pencils, slide rules, and adding machines to calculate the numbers that would launch rockets into space.

THE NINE OF US (*Jean Kennedy Smith*) Ambassador Jean Kennedy Smith, the last surviving child of Joe and Rose Kennedy, offers an intimate and illuminating look at a time long ago. Before she and her siblings emerged as leaders on the world stage, they were a loving circle of brothers and sisters who played football, swam, read, and pursued their own interests.

HUNGRY HEART (*Jennifer Weiner*) In her first foray into nonfiction, the bestselling novelist (*Good in Bed* and *Best Friends Forever*) takes the raw stuff of her personal life and spins it into essays on modern womanhood: sex, weight, envy, money, her mom's newfound lesbianism, and her estranged father's death. Funny and moving

AUDIO

YOU WILL KNOW ME (*Megan Abbott*) When a violent death rocks their close-knit gymnastics community just weeks before a major competition, everything Olympic hopeful Devon Knox and her parents have worked so hard for is at risk. As rumors swirl, Devon's mother tries to hold her family together while finding herself irresistibly drawn to the crime itself and the dark corners it threatens to illuminate.

THE BAD-ASS LIBRARIANS OF TIMBUKTU (*Joshua Hammer*) To save precious, centuries-old Arabic texts from al Qaeda, a band of librarians in Timbuktu pulls off a brazen heist worthy of Ocean's Eleven. Mild-mannered archivist and historian Abdel Kader Haidara

spearheaded the effort to sneak 350,000 ancient Islamic and secular manuscripts from Timbuktu to safety in southern Mali.

THE LANGOLIERS (*Stephen King*) Take a red-eye flight from LA to Boston into a most unfriendly sky. Only 11 passengers survive, but landing in an eerily empty world makes them wish they hadn't. Something's waiting for them, you see.

IN A DARK, DARK WOOD (*Ruth Ware*) Leonora, a reclusive crime writer, reluctantly agrees to a countryside weekend away. Two days later she wakes up injured in a hospital bed with the knowledge that someone is dead, but without the memory of what happened.

ORCHID BLUES (*Stuart Woods*) A brutal bank robbery foils Chief of Police Holly Barker's wedding day. When she should be saying "I do," she's investigating the murder of her fiancé. Grinding through her heartbreak, sucked into a whirlpool of crazed criminality, she learns too late that the FBI can't help. She's on her own — as always.

As you are aware, LTFD has become one of the best fire departments in the Texas Panhandle and have several mutual aid agreements with local Fire Departments for our services in time of need. LTFD has also provided medical care and ambulance service to Lake Tanglewood and the surrounding neighborhoods and cities for many years, however due to increased regulation costs and the shortage of licensed staffing; LTFD no longer provides licensed ambulance service. We will continue to provide First Responder Service's and have the intentions of being here for you in your time of need, whether fire or medical emergency.

Due to the loss of the ambulance income we find ourselves struggling with the cost of day to day operations and need your assistance with operations and the note on our newly/used fire engine that was obtained in November of 2015. Original cost of the used fire engine was \$145,500.00, through donations, fundraisers, and savings, LTFD has at this time paid the note down to a balance of \$65,000.00.

Village Notes

May 6th is the next Texas Election Day. In addition to any county and state ballot initiatives, all five Lake Tanglewood aldermen and mayor are up for election (or reelection). The deadline to submit applications is February 17th. Application packets (to run for alderman or mayor) can be picked up in the LSIOT office daily or from the village secretary on Monday and Friday afternoon. I don't know (as of Jan 19th) what aldermen will run for reelection or what residents will throw their hat in the ring. I do know we have been blessed with five outstanding aldermen, each having a different background but common desire to faithfully serve our village. It has been my pleasure working with them and I will strongly endorse any of them who choose to run for reelection.

That said, as residents of the village it is important for all of us to be involved in our future as a community. One way to stay involved is to exercise our civic responsibility of voting. Mark your calendar for Election Day May 6th and check the local newspaper or Randall County website for polling places.

Speaking of the Village Office, I would like to **welcome Erin Sprague** (new village secretary) on board. Erin is a graduate student at WTAMU and comes to us with a solid background and glowing references.

In addition to being involved in our community through voting, here is an **opportunity to volunteer.** Our volunteer fire department is a certified First Responder Organization (FRO). This means they will be the first responders on scene at a medical emergency, accident or injury in our village. It is their responsibility to render emergency first aid to and stabilize the patient until an ambulance arrives and then assist the paramedics until they transport the patient. Our fire department has two paramedics plus EMTs. They still require additional trained personnel.

You can volunteer to assist with this vital mission by attending the Emergency Care Attendant (ECA) Class and receiving Texas State ECA Certification. The class will be held at the Randall County Fire Headquarters on Monday and Thursday evenings during Mar, Apr and May. There is no cost for this class. For further information contact the LTVFD Chief, Robert Hulsey at (806)206-4684.

Our **Warning Siren** project is slowly progressing. We will have opened the bids/proposals we receive at the January 23rd Village Meeting. In addition to a committee of aldermen that will review the bids/proposals, the bids/proposals will be reviewed by Amarillo Office of Emergency Management to insure they will integrate with the Amarillo warning system and the Panhandle Regional Planning Commission to insure they comply with the federal, state and grant restrictions. Barring any unforeseen issues, I anticipate a contract late February to mid March. Installation should start shortly thereafter, with the project hopefully being complete by the start of summer.

We started applying for the warning siren grant after the February 2011 wild fire. The lack of any mass warning system was brought to the front by the no warning evacuation on that day. Wild fires aren't the only motivation for this project. The village also has a ten inch high pressure natural gas line passing through the village and under the lake as well as two petroleum lines crossing the village and lake at the big bridge. Add the threat of severe weather and tornados to the mix and it was an easy decision to pursue this grant.

It is important to understand that warning sirens are not the primary warning system. They are a component of a layered warning system. This system is comprised of the weather radio (primary), TV, cell phone, computer and warning siren. The warning siren is primarily an out of doors warning/alert system.

Last, is a reminder that Lake Tanglewood ordinances prohibit dogs from running free in the village. There is a **leash ordinance** that requires dogs to be indoors, in a fenced yard, restrained by a leash or under voice control. There have been several instances of dogs threatening and biting residents and pets and dogs chasing deer and other wildlife. Be a good neighbor and control your pets.
