Thank you to all who attended the January 30, 2020 Annual Meeting and thank you to everyone who voted. Special thanks to outgoing Board Members Kelvin Betzen and Gary Schneck for volunteering their time and service to the community. Since the Annual Meeting will be so late in the month this year, the Board of Director election results and 2020 officers will be included in the March newsletter.

Projects planned for 2020 include widening the road towards the end of Cedar Ln., installing an outdoor cover to protect maintenance equipment, and updating the community center. The community center update, currently scheduled for September 2020, will include removing the pond, fireplace, wall partitions, and replacing the carpet and tile with wood-like porcelain planks. Also, we plan on chip sealing North Shore, South Shore, Bayshore, Tanglewood Dr., Turtle Creek, and the Community Center parking lot.

An automated water level monitoring system has been installed on our public water system tanks and pump house. This will give our maintenance the ability to obtain instantaneous status of tank levels, pressure tank measurements, and useful monitoring data. The system will also alert personnel of problems with tank levels and pressure tank issues immediately, which will help us to detect and fix problems within our water supply as quickly as possible.

Don't forget to come join us at the Restaurant. The daily specials are posted on Facebook and the Sunday brunch is from 9am to 1pm weekly with the **"Best Omelet in Town"**. Our restaurant also makes excellent soups daily.

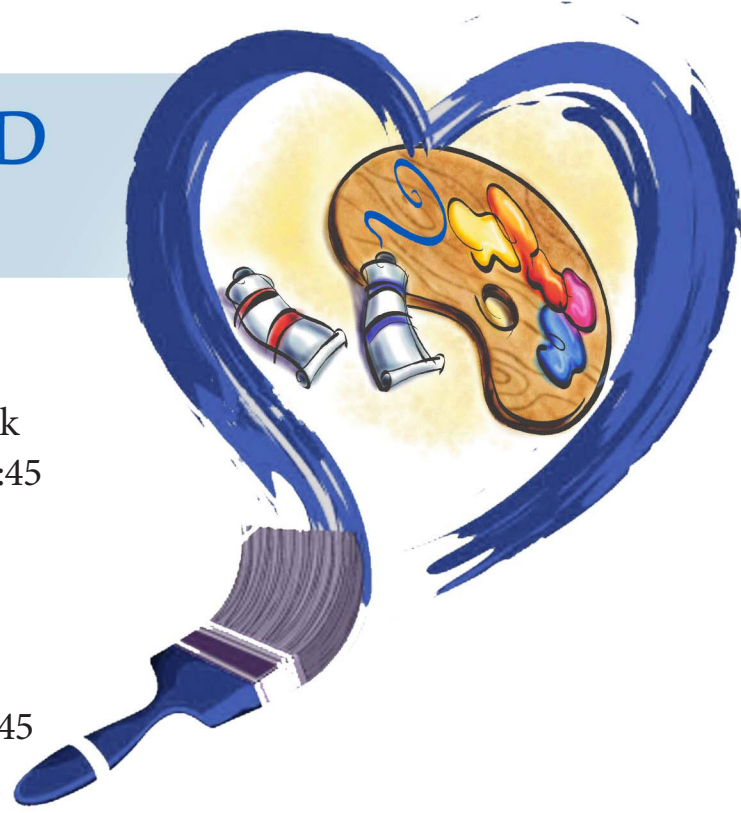

Greetings from the Lake Tanglewood Anglers Club. LTAC.

We stocked a total of 2600 crappie and 2600 black bass on Friday the 24th of January. That was the fall part of our bi-yearly stocking program. Catfish seem to be doing well from most reports we get so we are concentrating on the bass and crappie for now.

We will be doing a lake electrofishing study at the end of February/ first of March to get some idea of the various species that we have in the lake and their numbers. This will determine if we need to control some less desirable fish in our impoundment. Lake Master Pros from OK will perform the operation. The Club had a meeting on January to set up tournament dates . The first tourney will be Saturday, March 14. We will be posting info for the Club, our projects and tournament dates on the LT Facebook page and if you want to get on the LTAC mailing list, contact the office and they will direct you.

What we do for the lake as a fishery and place to enjoy the water today will impact future generations and guarantee it as a very special place in the Panhandle of the great State of Texas. Many thanks to LSIOT, LT Lions Club and LTAC for all their help in our endeavors.

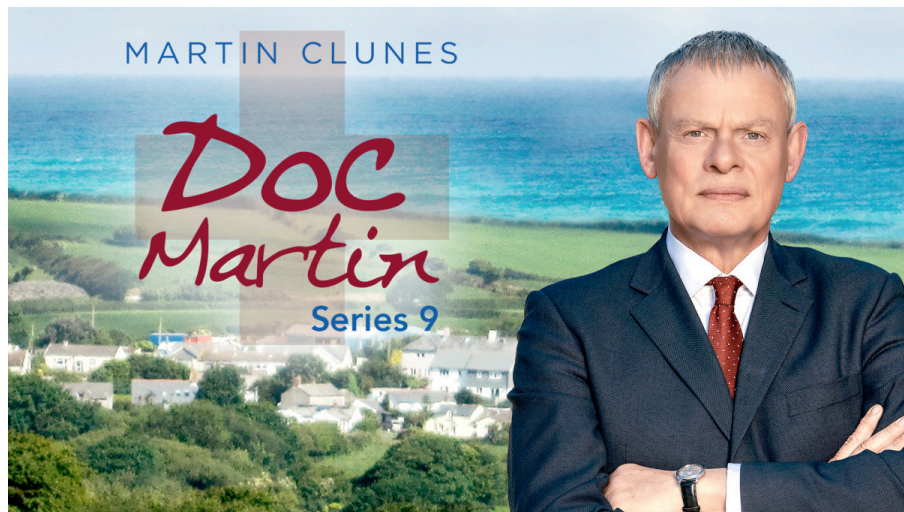
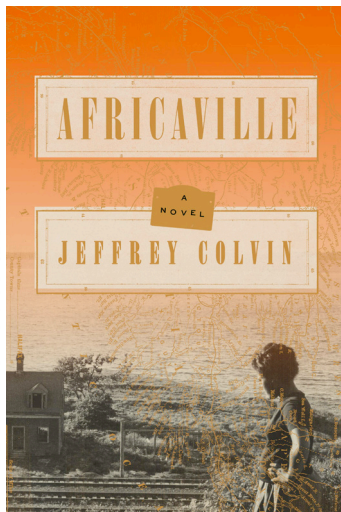
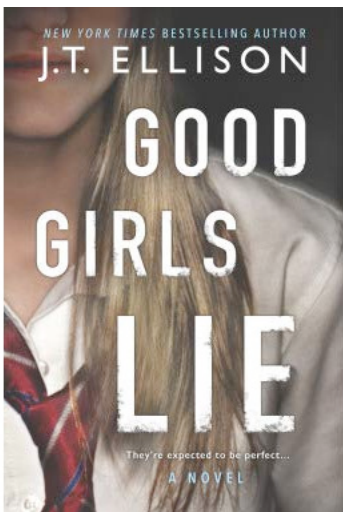

Building Permits

Village Ordinance requires most construction projects to obtain a building permit prior to beginning construction within Lake Tanglewood boundaries. Failure to obtain a permit may result in a substantial fine.

To obtain a Building Permit, a member must submit a Building Permit application and supplement documents (outlined in the application). Building Permit applications are available at Village Hall, Lake Tanglewood Corporation Office (LSIOT), or online at www.laketanglewood.org

Completed applications and documents may be emailed or dropped off in person to Village Hall or the LSIOT Office.

Building Permit applications must be submitted no later than noon on the Friday of the week prior to the Building Committee Meeting to be considered.

Roofing Permits can be obtained during normal business hours, with the submission of a Roofing Permit application.

Hello Hacker and Swingers,

Do you struggle with your chipping and putting? I do, it seems to change daily .I recently saw this article on putting and a great way for us to practice by Patty Berg, Pro Golfer.

It's some great advice, I hope you enjoy.

“There is nothing in this game of golf that can’t be improved upon if you practice”

When practicing your putting, the key distances most amateurs should focus on is between 4-10 feet and 21-50 feet from the pin.

Most players even of greatly differing skill levels, will make more putts within 4 feet. However when you stretch that to 10 feet better golfers will sink significantly more of those while amateurs will often two- putt. The same applies on those putts 21 to 50 feet as golfers with high handicaps will often three-putt more skilled golfers will two-putt. Focused on those distances on the practice greens and you should see an improvement in your scores.”

I love that bit of advice. Just so you know there is a practice putting green on the south side of our club house and just south of the 18th green we have a practice chipping and putting green.
