

#### **FICTION**

**COOKING FOR PICASSO** (*Camille Aubray*) In 1936 a young chef finds her life transformed when internationally renowned artist Pablo Picasso arrives in her seaside village in the South of France. Their encounter ties into a suspenseful present-day story involving the young chef's American granddaughter.

**MOONGLOW** (*Michael Chabon*) An elderly man's deathbed confession revisits an entire era through a single life, from the Jewish slums of prewar South Philadelphia to the invasion of Germany, from a Florida retirement village to a New York prison, to the twilight of the American Century.

**THE SPY** (*Paulo Coelho*) Mata Hari was penniless when she arrived in Paris. Within months, the dancer and courtesan was the most celebrated woman in the city. But during the Great War her lifestyle brought her under suspicion, and in 1917 she was arrested and accused of espionage. Told in her voice through her final letter, it is the story of a woman who defied convention and paid the ultimate price.

**THE INHERITANCE** (*Charles Finch*) A mysterious bequest of money leads to a murder. Before Charles Lenox can solve it, he is forced to confront the most dangerous of London's East End gangs and the far more genteel denizens of the illustrious Royal Society.

**THE WHOLE TOWN'S TALKING** (Fannie Flagg) Elmwood Springs, Missouri, is a small town like any other, but something strange is happening out at the cemetery. "Resting place" turns out to be a bit of a misnomer; "Still Meadows," as the cemetery is called, is anything but still!

**CONCLAVE** (*Robert Harris*) The Pope is dead. Behind the locked doors of the Sistine Chapel, 120 cardinals will cast their votes in the world's most secretive election. They are holy men. But they have ambition. And they have rivals. Over the next 72 hours, one of them will become the most powerful spiritual figure on earth.

**SWING TIME** (*Zadie Smith*) Two brown girls in London dream of being dancers. But only one has talent. The other has ideas: about rhythm and time, about black bodies and black music, what constitutes a tribe, or makes a person truly free. It's a close but complicated childhood friendship that ends abruptly in their early 20s, never to be revisited, but never quite forgotten, either.

#### **NON FICTION**

ALL THE GALLANT MEN (Donald Stratton) The extraordinary first and only memoir by a survivor of the USS Arizona, published at the 75th anniversary of Pearl Harbor. Nineteen-year-old Seaman First Class Stratton miraculously escaped the inferno that engulfed the battleship when the bombs hit, sustaining burns over 65 percent of his body. After more than a year of grueling treatment, Stratton remained determined to return to war, battling Navy bureaucracy to re-enlist, and participated in some of the bloodiest battles of the Pacific, including the invasion of New Guinea and Okinawa.

#### **AUDIO**

THE LAST MILE (David Baldacci) Convicted murderer Melvin Mars is granted a reprieve from execution for the killing of his parents 20 years ago. Another man has confessed. Amos Decker, newly hired on an FBI special task force, wonders if the confessor is telling the truth. Who wants Mars out of prison? And why now? Second in the series featuring investigator Amos Decker, the man unable to forget anything.

**HOME** (*Harlan Coben*) A decade ago, kidnappers grabbed two boys from wealthy families, demanded a ransom, and went silent. No trace of the boys ever surfaced. Until now. Myron Bolitar and his friend Win think they have located one of the boys, now a teenager. Where has he been and what does he know?

**THE WHITE HOUSE CONNECTION** (*Jack Higgins*) Someone is killing off members of the Sons of Erin splinter group – and the consequences are staggering. Two governments could fall, derailing the Irish peace process. Now former terrorist Sean Dillon and White House insider Blake Johnson, the duo featured in The President's Daughter, must stop the assassin before all hell breaks loose.

**RIVER OF TIME** (*Naomi Judd*) The beloved country music star opens up about her battle with severe depression, panic attacks, PTSD, and addiction. Naomi spent more than two years in psychiatric hospitals undergoing treatment. She shares a message of hope after surviving the most painful period of her life.

**THE PRESIDENTS SHADOW** (*Brad Meltzer*) Beecher White, national archivist (and member of a secret society charged with protecting presidency), finds a chopped-off arm in the White House's Rose Garden. It's a message for the President, and leads to some unpalatable truths about Beecher's own father.

**ME BEFORE YOU** (*Jojo Moyes*) Ordinary Louisa Clark has never been away from home. She takes a badly needed job working for moody, bossy, ex-Master of the Universe Will Traynor, who is a quadriplegic after an accident. Lou refuses to treat him with kid gloves, and when she learns he has shocking plans of his own, she sets out to show him life is still worth living.

**CODE OF CONDUCT** (*Brad Thor*) Counterterrorism operative Scot Harvath is tapped to undertake the deadliest assignment of his career. Four seconds of video anonymously transmitted to Washington, D.C., exposes the devastating agenda of a secret committee hidden deep within one of the world's most powerful organizations.

**TONY AND SUSAN** (*Austin Wright*) Susan Morrow is asked to read her ex-husband's unpublished novel. As the fictional family's lives are disastrously, violently, sent off course, she is plunged back into the past, forced to confront the darkness in her, and driven to name the fear that gnaws at her future and will change her life.

**A TOUCH OF STARDUST** (*Kate Alcott*) When Julie Crawford leaves Fort Wayne, Indiana, for Hollywood, she never imagines she'll cross paths with Carole Lombard, the dazzling actress from Julie's hometown. Lombard hires her as an assistant and invites her into the glamorous world Carole shares with Clark Gable – who is about to make movie history as the dashing Rhett Butler.

As you are aware, LTFD has become one of the best fire departments in the Texas Panhandle and have several mutual aid agreements with local Fire Departments for our services in time of need. LTFD has also provided medical care and ambulance service to Lake Tanglewood and the surrounding neighborhoods and cities for many years, however due to increased regulation costs and the shortage of licensed staffing; LTFD no longer provides licensed ambulance service. We will continue to provide First Responder Service's and have the intentions of being here for you in your time of need, whether fire or medical emergency.

Due to the loss of the ambulance income we find ourselves struggling with the cost of day to day operations and need your assistance with operations and the note on our newly/used fire engine that was obtained in November of 2015. Original cost of the used fire engine was \$145,500.00, through donations, fundraisers, and savings, LTFD has at this time paid the note down to a balance of \$65,000.00.
