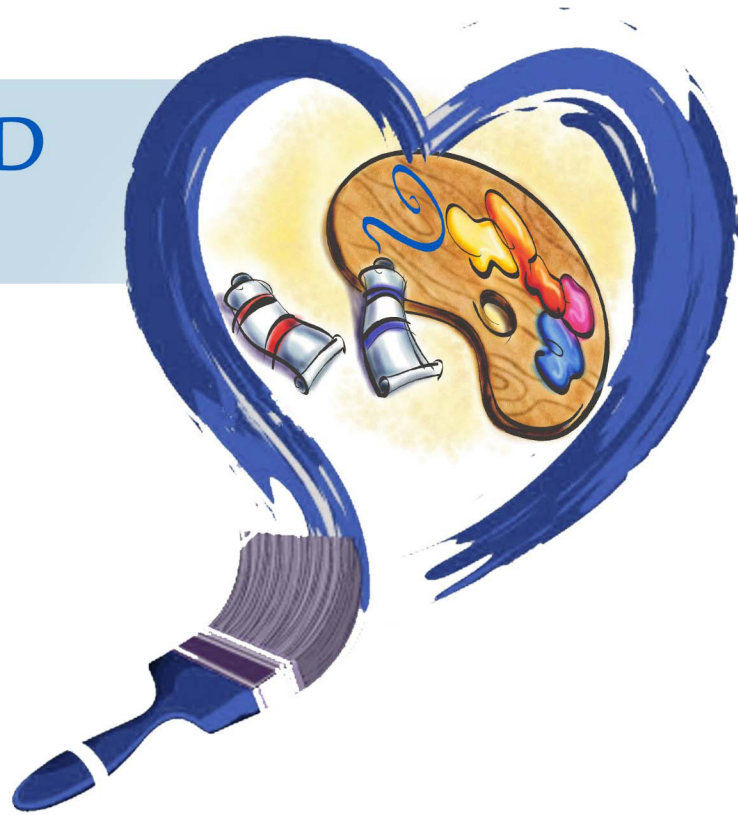

FICTION

THE SANDCASTLE GIRLS (*Chris Bohjalian*) New Yorker Laura has never given her Armenian heritage much thought, but when a friend sees a newspaper photo purportedly of Laura's grandmother promoting a Boston museum exhibit, she embarks on a journey back through her family's tragic history—and the Armenian genocide—that reveals love, loss, and a wrenching secret buried for generations.

SWORN TO SILENCE (*Linda Castillo*) In Painters Mill, Ohio, the Amish and "English" residents have lived side by side for two centuries. But sixteen years ago, a series of brutal murders shattered the peaceful farming community. A young Amish girl named Kate Burkholder survived the terror of the Slaughterhouse Killer...but ultimately decided to leave her community.

LAROSE (*Louise Erdrich*) After Landreaux accidentally shoots his neighbor's five-year-old son, he turns to an Ojibwe sweat lodge for guidance. He and his wife agree to give their own five-year-old son, LaRose, to the dead boy's family. Years later, when an enemy of Landreaux hurls accusations of a cover-up, he threatens the tenuous peace that has kept the two families whole.

I'LL SEE YOU IN PARIS (*Michelle Gable*) Annie is newly engaged and an old question resurfaces: who is her father, and what happened to him? Her mother has always been vague about the details. The key to unlocking the secrets starts with a mysterious book about an infamous woman known as the Duchess of Marlborough, which takes Annie from a charming English hamlet to a decaying estate, and ultimately to Paris.

HERE'S TO US (*Elin Hilderbrand*) Celebrity chef Deacon Rowe is struggling with addiction, depression, and two scandals. He takes his own life on the idyllic eastern bluff of Nantucket. In the wake of Deacon's suicide, his first wife and childhood sweetheart, Laurel Rowe, sets out to gather his far-flung family—including their son and Deacon's other ex-wives and children – on the island.

HIGH DIVE (*Jonathan Lee*) In September 1984, a bomb was planted at the Grand Hotel in the seaside town of Brighton, England, set to explode in twenty-four days when the British prime minister and her cabinet would be there. The story switches among the perspectives of Dan, a young IRA explosives expert; Moose, a former star athlete gone to seed, who is now the deputy hotel manager; and Freya, his teenage daughter, trying to decide what comes after high school. As the prime minister's arrival draws closer, each of their lives will be transformed forever.

TITANS (*Leila Meacham*) In early 1900s Texas, Samantha Gordon is the privileged heiress to a sprawling cattle ranch near Fort Worth. Nathan is a sweet-natured, charming farm boy from far north Texas. They connect, then love, lose, and betray, as changes sweep the rustic Texas countryside.

LAKE HOUSE (*Kate Morton*) Decades ago, Alice's 18-month-old brother vanished without a trace during a gala at the family estate. Meanwhile, Sadie, a young London detective visiting her grandfather's house in the area, stumbles across information involving the case. The resulting events bring Sadie and Alice together and reveal shocking truths about the past.

DEATH ON PARADISE CREEK (*Dianne Smithwick-Braden*) The Paradise Creek Inn is open for business in rural Texas. Business is slow except for the occasional party for family or friends, until a prestigious actor becomes stranded on the property. Suddenly Lizzie Fletch and her family are booking events left and right—a dream come true, or is it?

DEATH UNDER A FULL MOON (*Dianne Smithwick-Braden*) Wade and Lizzie attend a dinner party near the small community of Rayland, Texas. One week later, one of the guests is murdered. With his only female deputy out on maternity leave, Sheriff Asams makes a quick decision to deputize Lizzie.

BIOGRAPHY

OLD AGE: A BEGINNERS GUIDE (*Michael Kinsley*) In this series of essays, Michael Kinsley uses his own battle with Parkinson's disease to unearth answers to questions we are all at some time forced to confront. "Sometimes," he writes, "I feel like a scout from my generation, sent out ahead to experience in my fifties what even the healthiest Boomers are going to experience in their sixties, seventies, or eighties."

THE BRIDGE LADIES (*Betsy Lerner*) After years of living far apart—figuratively and literally—the author became a regular at her elderly mother's Monday bridge club. Through her friendship with the ladies, she is able to face years of misunderstanding and family tragedy. She learns that, while Facebook is great, it won't deliver a pot roast.

HEAVEN IS A BREATH AWAY (*Valerie Paters and Cheryl Schuelke*) When a massive pile up on an Arizona highway caused Valerie Paters and her jeep to be entombed beneath a semi truck in a snowstorm, Valerie was hospitalized and placed on life support. She stood in the radiant presence of Jesus. Down on earth her sister Cheryl prayed for her to live.

NON-FICTION

THE NOTICER (*Andy Andrews*) In this blend of fiction, allegory, and inspiration, Andrews tells the story of Jones—a mysterious man who shows up when things look the darkest for the people of Orange Beach, Alabama, and whose unique gift of noticing things that others miss helps us understand why things happen and what we can do about it.

LOVE THAT BOY (*Ron Fournier*) A prominent journalist writes movingly of the outsized and crushing expectations that come from parents and with parenting today, through the lens of his relationship with his son, Tyler, who has mild Asperger's.

IN HARM'S WAY: THE SINKING OF THE USS INDIANAPOLIS AND THE EXTRAORDINARY STORY OF ITS SURVIVORS (*Doug Stanton*) America's worst naval disaster—the sinking of the USS "Indianapolis"—and the heroism of the men who, against all odds, survived.

AUDIO

MY GRANDMOTHER ASKED ME TO TELL YOU SHE'S SORRY (*Fredrik Backman*) When seven-year-old Elsa's grandmother dies, she leaves behind a series of letters. These send Elsa on a journey that brings to life the world of her grandmother's fairy tales—found in an apartment building full of drunks, monsters, attack dogs, and old crones.

A HERO OF FRANCE (*Alan Furst*) In the secret hotels, nightclubs, and cafes of occupied Paris, French Resistance leader Mathieu and his team help downed British airmen escape back to England. They face a threat, dispatched by the Reich to destroy them all. *A Hero of France* is sure to please existing Furst fans and attract new ones.

THE CHILDREN (*Ann Leary*) The captivating story of a wealthy but unconventional New England family, told from the perspective of Charlotte, a reclusive 29-year-old who has a secret (and famous) life on the internet. As her stepbrother's wedding draws near, flaws surface in the family's polite veneer and unfortunate truths are exposed.

BILL O'REILLY'S LEGENDS AND LIES: THE PATRIOTS (*David Fisher*) From the riots over a child's murder that led to the Boston Massacre to the little-known southern guerilla campaign of "Swamp Fox" Francis Marion and the celebration of America's first Christmas, here are the fascinating tales of resourcefulness, perseverance, and luck that led to this country's creation.

Village ordinance requires all construction projects to obtain a building permit prior to beginning construction within the LT boundaries. Failure to obtain a permit may result in a substantial fine.

To obtain a BUILDING PERMIT, you must submit a BUILDING PERMIT APPLICATION. Building Permit Applications are available at the Village Hall, Lake Tanglewood Corporation Office, or online at www.laketanglewood.org

BUILDING PERMIT APPLICATIONS must be submitted one week before the next Building Committee Meeting. Meetings are held on Wednesday, 5:30pm at Village Hall.

As we continue our summer recreation and boating season, I ask you to not drop your guard. Always **keep safety as a top priority**. Follow the lake safety rules, always practice fire safety and remember to share the road.

Mark your calendars for the **annual tailgate party** on **Aug 13th**. Bring plenty of food and beverages, fellowship with your neighbors and enjoy the live music.

Another important date is **Saturday, Sept 10th**. This is the date for our annual **TRIathlon**. The TRIathlon is our annual **Children's Miracle Network Fundraiser** and attracts several hundred competitors and visitors. Traffic will be disrupted and rerouted between approximately 9:30AM and 12:00Noon that morning to accommodate the runners and bikers. Please be cautious and courteous and follow the directions of traffic control volunteers.

Watch the marquee for an update for the **village rabies clinic**. It will be Saturday, July 30th from 9:00-11:00AM on the patio at the village hall.

July 4th is almost here. Weather permitting, the **fireworks** will be at dark on Sunday **July 3rd** and the **parade and picnic will be July 4th**. Plan for a significant traffic backup at the gate on July 3rd (fireworks day) as our population doubles on that day. The backup can extend around the curve and up the hill. Be patient, be courteous and show respect to the gate personnel. Sherry and her folks do a super job, but we only have one gate.

Remember, **fireworks are illegal** in the village. Violators will receive a citation.

Village of Lake Tanglewood Roofing Requirements (2016)

Permits are required for all roofing projects over 100 sq. ft. Residential roofing permits are \$50.00 with one inspection (min.) at \$125.00. (Note: new construction roofing will be included in the new home construction permit. A separate permit is not required).

Roof coverings of asphalt shingle, wood, slate, clay, cement, or asbestos cement tile shall not be installed without first removing all existing layers of roof coverings. An additional layer of those materials on top of an existing layer is not permitted: {see exceptions for complete and separate metal roofing systems in the 2015 International Residential Code}

Wood shakes and shingles shall only be used on solid sheathing.

Required Information on Building Permit Application for Roofing:

- Section I All homeowner's information.
- Section II All contractor's contact and insurance (bonding and liability) information.
- Section III State type of building (main dwelling, detached garage, shed, etc.) and type of roof material (asphalt shingle, wood, etc.). If this is the main dwelling, please indicate if there is an attached garage or any fuel-fired appliances.

Carbon Monoxide Alarms

Carbon Monoxide Alarms are required in dwellings that have attached garages or fuel-fired appliances. A minimum of one (1) CO alarm is required at each sleeping area, outside the bedroom(s). Example: a hallway common to one or more bedroom doorways is considered a sleeping area. It is possible to have a combination smoke and carbon monoxide alarm.

Approved alarms shall be installed in accordance with manufacturer's installation instructions or located on the wall at a height 42 to 90 inches above floor, avoiding locations near heating/cooling vents or areas which provide turbulent airflow, and minimum 36 inches away from openings to areas of high humidity. Avoid installing CO alarms in kitchens or above fuel-burning appliances.

In order to pass the roofing inspection, required CO alarm(s) must be installed.

The Building Committee recommends obtaining the services of a roofing contractor who is licensed with the City of Amarillo or with the City of Canyon. These contractors carry a \$20,000 bond and \$300,000 residential liability insurance.

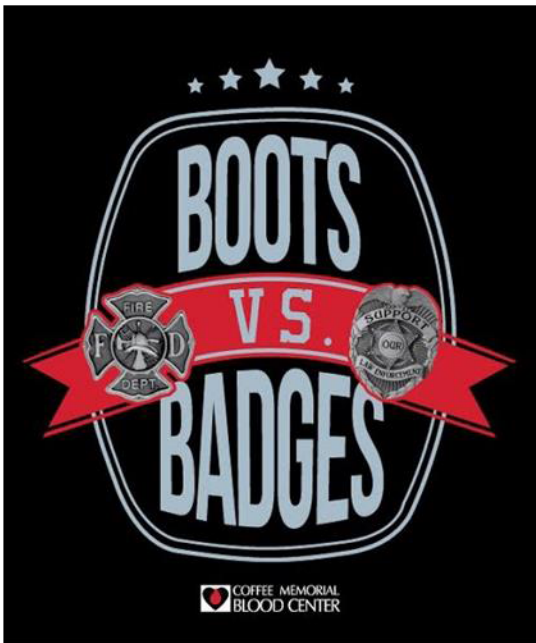
