- July 26th - Business Meeting.

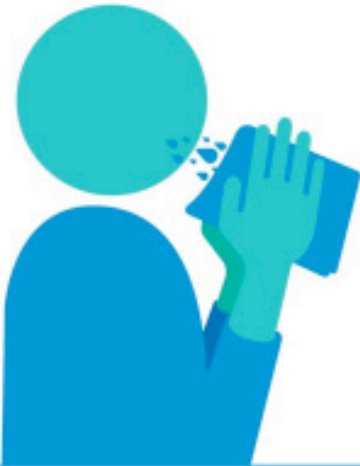


REMEMBER THE 3 C's!

FICTION

The Women of Great Heron Lake by Deanna Lynn Sletten - *Women's Fiction*

Two strong women, generations apart, living parallel lives. An inspiring family saga of two determined woman who found meaning in their lives by following their passions and not allowing society, or propriety, to hold them back.

The Fallen Architect by Charles Belfoure - (NYT best-selling author of *The Paris Architect*)– *Thriller/Historical*
Wrongly imprisoned in the wake of a fatal building collapse, a disgraced architect struggles to prove his innocence at the same time he discovers that he is still being targeted. By the *New York Times* best-selling author of *The Paris Architect*.

The Law of Innocence by Michael Connelly – *Thriller/Legal*

Defense attorney Mickey Haller utilizes his legal team's resources from behind bars to organize his own defense when he is framed for murder by an unknown adversary.

Win by Harlan Coben – *Thriller/Crime* (Windsor Horne Lockwood III #1 Series)

Over twenty years ago, the heiress Patricia Lockwood was abducted during a robbery of her family's estate, then locked inside an isolated cabin for months. Patricia escaped, but so did her captors and the items stolen from her family were never recovered. Until now....a reclusive dead man...a murder....domestic terrorist conspirators....

Ocean Prey by John Sanford – *Fiction/Crime* – (Prey Series: Lucas Davenport #31 and Virgil Flowers #13)

An off-duty Coast Guardsman is fishing with his family in the Atlantic just off south Florida when he sees, and then calls in, some suspicious behavior in a nearby boat. It's a snazzy craft, slick and outfitted with extra horsepower, and is zipping along until it slows to pick up a surfaced diver . . . a diver who was apparently alone, without his own boat, in the middle of the ocean.

Surviving Savannah by Patti Callahan – *Historical Fiction/Southern*

It was called "The Titanic of the South." The luxury steamship, Pulaski, sank in 1838 with Savannah's elite on board. Through time, their fates were forgotten--until the wreck was found (180 yrs later) and now their story is finally told in this breathtaking novel from the NYT bestselling author of *Becoming Mrs. Lewis*.

The Last Green Valley by Mark T. Sullivan– (Author of *Under a Scarlet Sky*) – *Historical & Biographical Fiction*

In late March 1944, as Stalin's forces push into Ukraine, Emil and Adeline Martel must make a terrible decision: Do they wait for the Soviet bear's intrusion and risk being sent to Siberia? Or do they reluctantly follow the wolves—murderous Nazi officers who have pledged to protect “pure-blood” Germans?

Murder on Wall Street by Victoria Thompson – *Gaslight Mystery #24 – Historical Fiction/Mystery/Detective*

Midwife Sarah Brandt Malloy and her detective husband, Frank, scour the upper echelons of society as well as Gilded Age New York City's highest-risk areas to prove a family man's innocence of the murder of a prominent – but despised - society banker.

Refuge by Dot Jackson – *Historical Fiction/Southern*

In 1929 Mary Seneca Steele spontaneously packs a suitcase, gathers up her son and daughter, and steals away in her abusive and dissolute husband's brand new Auburn Phaeton automobile leaving her privileged life in Charleston behind. It is the beginning of a journey of enlightenment that leads Mary “Sen” to the mountains and mysteries of Appalachia where she will learn unexpected family secrets and create a new life - before tragedy will test her again.

Dear Robert Hulsey:

Insurance Services Office (ISO) has submitted a recommendation concerning your community's Public Protection Classification (PPC). Currently, the Community's Public Protection Classification is a Class **03**.

Insurance Services Office is recommending the classification to remain a Class 03 with an effective date of 11/1/2021. The recommendation is based on a review of your community performed on 7/1/2020 and **does not** include application of the Texas Exception to the Fire Suppression Rating Schedule.

With a single class rating, all class-rated properties will use **Class 03**.

Public Protection Classifications range from 1 (superior) to 10 (does not meet minimum qualifications).

We have reviewed the information provided and believe it is enough to grant approval. The Insurance Services Office will be notified of our approval of their recommendation and the effective date.

Please make sure all community officials and residents within your district are notified of the new Public Protection Classification rating for your community, and the effective date.

Village Ordinance requires most construction project to obtain a building permit prior to beginning construction within Lake Tanglewood boundaries.

To obtain a Building Permit, a member must submit a Building Permit application and supplement documents (as outlined in the application). Building Permit applications are available at Village Hall, Lake Tanglewood Corporation Office (LSIOT) or online at www.laketanglewood.org

Completed applications and documents may be emailed or dropped off in person to Village Hall or the LSIOT Office.

Building Permit applications must be submitted no later than noon the Friday prior to a Building Committee meeting (Wednesday).
