Also, companies like Panhandle Greenhouses and Pro-chem offer several safe products that can be applied around the home to help control the mosquito population.

Reminder – The brush pile and the grass clipping area are meant for tree limbs, brush, cattails, and grass clippings only. The dumping of lumber, cross ties, construction material, trash, and household trash <u>ARE NOT ALLOWED.</u> Anyone caught dumping unauthorized materials will be subject to a fine. Please help us keep these areas clean and let your contractors and landscaping companies be aware of this rule.
