## ***LAKE TANGLEWOOD LIBRARY***

**Read. Read. Read. Just don't read one type of book. Read different books by various authors so that you develop different styles.**

### ***FICTION***

**WITHOUT MERCY** (*Jefferson Bass*) Forensic anthropologist Dr. Bill Brockton investigates a bizarre murder and confronts a deadly enemy he thought he'd put behind bars for good.

**MY HUSBAND'S WIFE** (*Jane Corry*) When young lawyer Lily marries Ed, she's determined to make a fresh start, to leave the secrets of the past behind. But then she takes on her first murder case and meets Joe, a convicted murderer to whom Lily is strangely drawn. For whom she will soon be willing to risk almost anything.

**THE GIRL BEFORE** (*J.P. Delaney*) Jane feels fortunate when her rental application is accepted for One Folgate Street, a sleek, minimally designed building. She is drawn to the home's owner and architect, Edward. Until she learns that the previous tenant followed the same patterns, made the same choices, met the same people, and experienced the same terror as she is, before she died in mysterious circumstances.

**ORDINARY GRACE** (*William Kent Krueger*) In 1961 Frank Drum is a boy on the cusp of manhood. A typical 13-year-old with a strong, loving family, Frank is devastated when a tragedy forces him to face the unthinkable—and to take on maturity beyond his years.

**PACHINKO** (*Min Jin Lee*) In early 1900s Korea, Sunja, prized daughter of a poor yet proud family, has an unplanned pregnancy that threatens to shame them all. Deserted by her lover, she is saved when a young, tubercular minister marries her and brings her to Japan. So begins a saga of exceptional people in exile from a homeland they never knew, enduring both harsh discrimination and great joy.

**ROOMS** (*Lauren Oliver*) Wealthy Richard Walker has just died, and his estranged family have arrived for their inheritance. But the Walkers are not alone. Two long-dead former residents linger within the house's walls. The living and the dead are each haunted by painful truths that will surface with explosive force.

**ECHOES IN DEATH** (*J.D. Robb*) After a party in New York, Lieutenant Eve Dallas rides home with her billionaire husband, Roarke. When a young woman dazed, naked, and bloody wanders in front of their car, Roarke slams on the brakes just in time, and Eve, still in glittering gown and heels, springs into action.

**LINCOLN IN THE BARDO** (*George Saunders*) A story of familial love and loss that breaks free of its historical framework into a thrilling supernatural realm. When Abraham Lincoln's young son, Willie, dies in 1862, he finds himself in a strange purgatory—the Bardo, in the Tibetan tradition—where a monumental struggle erupts over young Willie's soul.

**A GENTLEMAN IN MOSCOW** (*Amor Towles*) In 1922, a Bolshevik tribunal sentences Count Alexander Rostov to house arrest in the attic of a grand hotel across the street from the Kremlin. In reduced circumstances, he views the most tumultuous decades in Russian history unfold outside the hotel's doors while endeavoring to understand what it means to be a man of purpose.



## **NON FICTION**

**A STOLEN LIFE** (*Jaycee Dugard*) The memoir of Jaycee Dugard. She was kidnapped in 1991 when she was 11 years old, and was missing for over 18 years before her reappearance in 2009. She tells the story of her captivity by Phillip Garrido and his wife, and opens up about how she feels one year after being found.

**90 CHURCH** (*Dean Unkefer*) Mad Men meets The Wire in this gripping true-crime memoir by a former agent at the Federal Bureau of Narcotics in 1960s New York. Before Nixon famously declared a "war on drugs," there was the Federal Bureau of Narcotics.

## **AUDIO**

**BRIT-MARIE WAS HERE** (*Fredrik Backman*) When Britt-Marie walks out on her cheating husband, she is drawn into the daily doings of her fellow citizens. And she is given the impossible task of leading the untalented children's soccer team to victory. In a town of big-hearted misfits, can she find a place where she truly belongs.

**THE CASE OF THE SUBSTITUTE FACE** (*Erle Stanley Gardner*) Perry Mason and Della Street are on an ocean cruise when a man is seen jumping off the ship, an apparent suicide. But when the body is recovered, it turns out that he was shot. Accused of murder, his wife puts her fate in the hands of Perry, who discovers that the husband had once accepted a huge bribe while serving on a jury.

**THE PASSENGER** (*Lisa Lutz*) She's left her husband dead and now Tanya Dubois is a fugitive. Tanya-once-Amelia-now-Debra and Blue, a bartender, have the courage and desperation to try to live off the grid. Hopscotching from city to city, Debra is chased by a very dark secret. Can she outrun her past?

**THE HUSBAND'S SECRET** (*Liane Moriarty*) Imagine that your husband wrote you a letter, to be opened only after his death, that contains his deepest, darkest secret—something that could destroy not only your life together but the lives of others as well. Imagine, then, that you stumble across that letter while your husband is very much alive.

## **BIOGRAPHY**

**THREE DAYS IN JANUARY** (*Bret Baier*) The three days between President Dwight Eisenhower's prophetic "farewell address" on the evening of January 17, 1961, and his successor John F. Kennedy's inauguration on the afternoon of January 20, was the final mission of one of modern America's greatest leaders.

**LOOK AT YOU NOW** (*Liz Pryor*) In 1979, Liz Pryor is a seventeen-year-old girl from a good family in the wealthy Chicago suburbs. Halfway through her senior year of high school, she discovers that she is pregnant—a fact her parents are determined to keep a secret from her friends, siblings, and community forever. One snowy January day, after driving across three states, her mother drops her off at what Liz thinks is a Catholic home for unwed mothers—but which is, in truth, a locked government-run facility for delinquent and impoverished pregnant teenage girls.

**DARLING DAYS** (*iO Tillett Wright*) Born into the beautiful bedlam of downtown New York in the '80s, iO Tillett Wright came of age at the intersection of punk, poverty, heroin, and art. This was a world of self-invented characters, glamorous superstars, and strung out sufferers, ground zero of drag and performance art. Still, no personality was more vibrant and formidable than her mother Rhonna, a showgirl and young widow, a mercurial, erratic Glamazon who was iO's fiercest defender and only authority in a world with few boundaries and even fewer indicators of normal life.

# VILLAGE NOTES

The deadline to submit an application to run for mayor or alderman has past. Several residents stepped up to volunteer and serve our community. The one candidate for mayor is Don Carver. Running for alderman are George Moore (currently mayor), Jim Rogers (incumbent), Robert Hulsey (incumbent), James Brown, DJ Powers, Charla Rose, and John Teague.

Monday, February 27th will have been the public drawing for the order the names will appear on the ballot. Notice of the drawing was posted and all candidates were notified of the drawing.

The only Randall County ballots will be for Lake Tanglewood and Timber Creek. Therefore, we will have to foot the total cost (Estimate \$4,000 - \$5,000) of our election and have a polling place here at the lake. The polling place will be in the village meeting room and will be open to meet the mandated requirements for early voting and voting on Election Day, May 6th. We will do our best to schedule voting for convenient hours. We will keep you advised once the dates and times have been established.

Road Rage is a topic that all too frequently is the subject of a tragic news story. We have all probably witnessed an example of a “hot tempered” driver without having been the target of a “rage filled” driver. I can only imagine the fear that a women alone in a car or having her children with her must experience when she is the target of road rage. Because this happened recently to one of our residents, I would like to share the following tips from the AAA and other sources.

If you are the target of road rage, several sources suggest the following:

1. Do not make eye contact with or attempt to engage the rage filled driver.
2. Attempt to safely separate yourself from the other vehicle.
3. If you or someone in your vehicle has a cell phone, dial 9-1-1.
  - a. Clearly describe what is happening
  - b. Follow the dispatcher’s instructions
  - c. Stay on the phone with the dispatcher
4. If no cell phone is available
  - a. Stop where there are people (i.e. convenience store, mall, etc.)
  - b. Stay in your car with the doors locked and windows closed.
  - c. Use your horn to attract attention. This will usually discourage an aggressor.
  - d. Do Not Go Home if an aggressor is following you.

Unfortunately, it is a crazy world we live in and we have to think defensively a lot more today than in the past.
