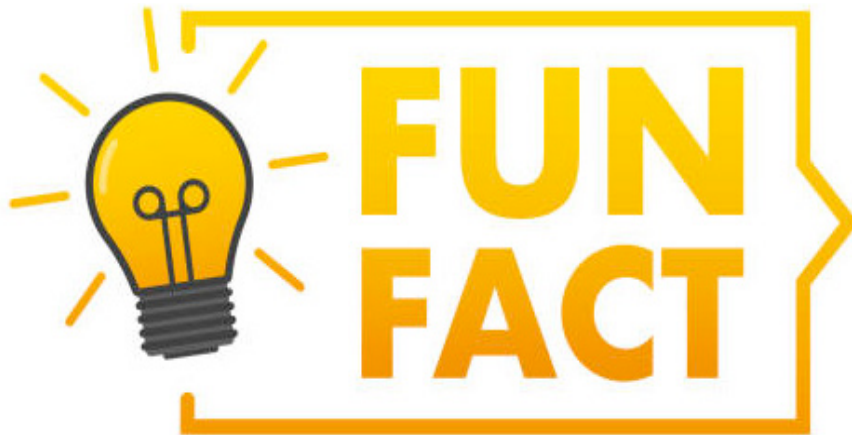

During February your Lake Tanglewood Fire Department trained on Patient assessment and obtaining Patient vital signs (blood pressure, heart rate, respiration rate, blood glucose levels, SpO2 (percent of oxygen-saturated hemoglobin in blood), ETCO2 (measurement of carbon dioxide being exhaled), blood glucose level, body temperature and acquisition of an EKG. Additionally, we trained on drafting water from sources such as livestock watering tanks or ponds which we use during wildfires when other water sources are not readily available.

March is a good time to check the smoke and carbon monoxide detectors in your home. These devices save lives by giving residents more time to escape a fire or carbon monoxide poisoning. By changing batteries twice a year, replacing smoke detectors every 10 years and proper placement of these devices in your home the chances of surviving a fire or carbon monoxide exposure are greatly improved. Please review the information below from the United States Fire Administration.

Hear the **BEEP** where you **SLEEP**

Every Bedroom Needs a Working Smoke Alarm!

Half of home fire deaths happen between 11 p.m. and 7 a.m., when most people are asleep.

Install smoke alarms in every bedroom, outside each separate sleeping area, and on every level of the home, including the basement. Larger homes may need more alarms.

For the best protection, install interconnected smoke alarms in your home. When one sounds, they all sound.

Test alarms at least once a month by pushing the test button.

Replace all smoke alarms when they are 10 years old or if they do not sound when tested.

Some people, especially children and older adults, may need help to wake up. Make sure someone will wake them if the smoke alarm sounds.

When the smoke alarm sounds, get outside and stay outside. Go to your outside meeting place.

Call the fire department from a cellphone or a neighbor's phone. Stay outside until the fire department says it's safe to go back inside.
