May 2026

The month of May was busy with numerous medical, grass and structure fire calls. Additionally, LTFD conducted several training sessions during the month. Two of our training sessions in March were in conjunction with our neighbors from Palisades Fire Department who came over to train with us.

One training was regarding our SCBA (self-contained breathing apparatus) that are worn during structure fire operations to protect the fire fighters from deadly smoke/heat. Since the SCBA is a vital component of fire fighter safety equipment it is imperative that we have a thorough working knowledge of the SCBA. This training involves one crew member taking the pack apart, tangling the straps & waist belt, air hose/regulator and any other mischievous ideas they have to make reassembling the pack as difficult as possible. A second blindfolded member then enters the room and begins to untangle and reassemble the pack by feel alone while wearing thermal insulated structure gloves.



For one of our other trainings We would like to thank the Mr. and Mrs. Daniels at 523 North Shore who volunteered their home for us to train. The Daniels will be building a new home and a few days prior to the demolition team showing up they graciously allowed us to spend a Saturday conducting numerous training events. Having the ability to train in homes prior to demolition is an invaluable opportunity for our members to conduct hands-on training scenarios in a more realistic setting. The Daniels joined us for the entire day and observed all of the training activities. Thank you Mr. and Mrs. Daniels and all of the firefighters that gave up their Saturday to train and be prepared for emergencies in our community!



The training exercise pictured below was self-rescue through an interior wall in the event a firefighter becomes trapped in a room. Each person punched holes through the sheetrock with a hand tool then crawled between the 16” studs to enter the adjoining room.



Blindfolded interior search and rescue training is critical to be able to locate a trapped or incapacitated occupant in a structure where smoke may limit the firefighter's ability to see the victim. This is done by feel working in a methodical method down the wall and around the room to prepare for working in poor visibility conditions.



Using a smoke generator machine we were able to fill portions of the home with thick smoke from ceiling to the floor to search and then rescue a person trapped in the home. The same drill was conducted to search, locate and rescue a downed firefighter.

One final training objective was vertical ventilation. By cutting holes at strategic locations in the roof of structure we are able to allow heat, smoke and toxic gases to escape the building thus improving interior visibility, rescue efforts, and reduce the risk of flashovers or backdrafts.



Skills trained on the for day included: Forcible entry, Interior search and Rescue, Hose advancement through the structure, Occupant rescue, Firefighter self-rescue, Firefighter rescue, Mayday training, Window removal for egress, and Vertical ventilation.

There was an error discovered at publishing of last newsletter. This is the corrected version.

As before, In the event of an emergency actually requiring an evacuation, LSIOT will send out a text to their distribution network. It will describe the emergency, its direction in relation to our village, and the best estimate of timing of the event. It will also be followed by notification from the Office of Emergency Management in Amarillo, targeting all cell phone users geolocated in the overall evacuation area. Depending on the event, this may also be followed by the Emergency Siren Notification System.

Our main exit is the most preferred path in and out of the lake. IF, for whatever reason that path is somehow compromised, either because of obstruction, or the emergency itself, there are 3 alternative exits out of the lake, marked on the map with a yellow "+" symbol.

From North Shore, opposite 501 North Shore, is the East Emergency Access road. There is a gate at the bottom of the hill, heading east from North Shore, with an additional gate intersecting John's Way in River Falls. At that intersection you would head north to the Claude Highway. River Falls also has a gate at their entrance, which is activated by presence just like our exit gate out of Lake Tanglewood. Be aware you will most likely not be able to gain entrance back in through their gate after exiting.

On the south end of the lake, Frog Leap Lane connects to South Shore Drive, and exits into the Canyons. You would drive up the hill, and they have a couple of signs helping to indicate the way out to exit from West County Club Rd onto FM 1541 (Washington), very close to the Timber Creek Small Animal hospital.

Alternatively on South Shore Drive turning north at the big bridge, it is also possible to exit into Palisades, eventually exiting on Osage at the Pac-A Sac on the Claude Highway.


It should also be noted that these exits are bi-directional. Our adjoining neighbors can also use these same exits if an emergency in their neighborhood requires it.

In addition to evacuation route designation, we have 2 preferred landing meeting points in the event of a medical emergency on the lake itself. There are 2 red cross symbols "+", one located at the end of the boat ramp on Jean Drive, off Melody, for the deep-water end of the lake, and the second located on the sidewalk shoreline between the boat gas pump and the swimming area. Certainly, any address can and will be responded to, but these 2 locations are designated for best access for rescue personnel and ambulance access.

Also following up from last month, the map also shows the fire hydrants in the water system, color coded by the available volume of water, that the fire department could use in the event of a structure fire in one of our homes. It was one of the factors used in our ISO Rating.




**Whether it's on the ground or flying around,
If it's a bat, don't touch that!**




It is tempting to pick up a bat because they look so unusual. Don't do it! Leave bats alone.




Bats are helpful in nature. However, they also can spread rabies.




Rabies is a deadly disease caused by a virus. You can get rabies if an animal that has rabies bites you. Bat teeth are so small you might not even know you were bitten!



You can also get rabies if the saliva from an animal with rabies gets in your eyes, nose, or mouth. This can happen if you get the saliva on your fingers and then touch your face. Another way you can get rabies is by touching an animal with rabies and getting its saliva in open cuts on your skin.



Tell an adult, such as a teacher, nurse, parent, school guard, or police officer, right away if you have touched a bat or a bat has touched you. There is medicine that can keep you from getting rabies. For the medicine to work well, it must be given soon after contact with a bat.



Remember, if you find any bat, even if it is dead, **do not touch it.** Tell an adult right away about the bat and where you found it.
