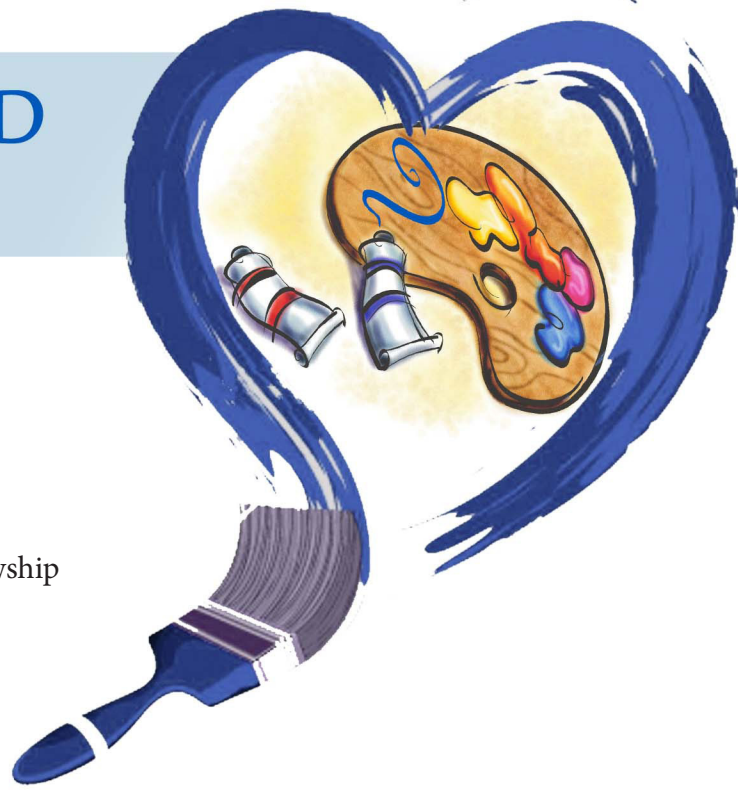

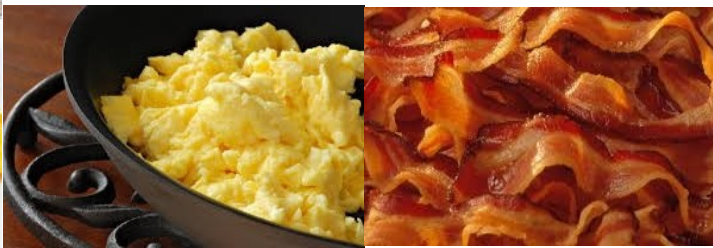

## **SOUTHWEST AMBUKS & LAKE TANGLEWOOD SERVICES**

You might not be familiar with Southwest AMBUKS; but AMBUKS and service to Lake Tanglewood (LT) go hand in hand. AMBUKS is a service organization that provides handicapped children and wounded veterans with special AMtrybes that help them with development. It also provides scholarships to physical & occupational therapy students from Texas Tech & speech pathology students from West Texas.

This past fiscal year AMBUKS gave away 104 AMtrybes valued at almost \$80,000; \$30,000 in scholarships. In June AMBUKS presented a check for \$39—— to the Amarillo City Council to purchase the equipment for a special needs park at MediPark.

The 20 members of AMBUKS that are Lake Tanglewood community members are very involved in activities at the lake. Below is a list of activities these people are involved in:

## Village Notes

The year seems to be flying by as it is already November. So far it has been a good year for fire safety – no major wild fires and no structural fires. Let's continue being safe through the winter. Remember, wild fires don't go by the calendar. We need to be careful throughout the year. Winter is a good time to clear dead brush from your property. If you have a fireplace or wood stove, this is the time of year to have your chimney cleaned and inspected. A chimney fire can quickly involve the structure and grow into a major fire. It is also a good time to have your furnace checked for proper operation and leaks. Carbon monoxide causes several deaths and hospitalizations every winter.

While on the subject of winter preparations, don't forget your car. Winter or all season tires, antifreeze, good battery and the proper weight oil are all important for safe driving during the winter months.

Another winter reminder is our village has a snow removal plan. Jeff and his crew do a super job of trying to stay ahead of winter weather events and keep our roads passable. Their first priority is to our first responders (fire department) and the main roads. As residents, we also have our responsibilities. These include restricting our driving before the roads are plowed/sanded; not parking on the paved portion of the streets (plows require safe access to our narrow streets) and clearing snow away from fire hydrants on or near their property.

One of the winter threats we face is the possibility of a significant freezing rain or sleet event. Should this occur, we might experience a wide area power outage resulting from downed power lines. Should this happen, we are prepared to open a short term emergency shelter at either the church or community center. Last winter in preparation for a forecast severe ice storm, we positioned and tested the emergency generator at the community center and placed emergency cots in the community center. If the situation arises, we will do the same again this year.

On February 27, 2011 our village and Palisades experienced a devastating wildfire. After the fire (which necessitated an evacuation) many residents expressed their concern that we didn't have any warning sirens in our village. Since then we have applied for several grants to fund the sirens. Persistence finally paid off as we received a FEMA grant which will pay 75% of the cost for two sirens. Our share will be approximately \$15,000 - \$20,000. If we can work through the purchase and installation process fast enough, the sirens should be operational by this spring. One siren will be near the intersection of Lago Vista and Tanglewood Dr and the other is planned for the loop at the end of South Shore. The sirens will be tied in with the Amarillo Emergency Ops Center and will also be able to be activated locally.

Don't forget! Sherry and Sheila are ready, willing and able take your application to fill a "to be vacated" position on the LSIOT Board. Applications are due now. The election is in January.

## **WE NEED YOUR HELP!!!!**

As you are aware, LTFD has become one of the best fire departments in the Texas Panhandle and have several mutual aid agreements with local Fire Departments for our services in time of need. LTFD has also provided medical care and ambulance service to Lake Tanglewood and the surrounding neighborhoods and cities for many years, however due to increased regulation costs and the shortage of licensed staffing; LTFD no longer provides licensed ambulance service. We will continue to provide First Responder Service's and have the intentions of being here for you in your time of need, whether fire or medical emergency.

Due to the loss of the ambulance income we find ourselves struggling with the cost of day to day operations and need your assistance with operations and the note on our newly/used fire engine that was obtained in November of 2015. Original cost of the used fire engine was \$145,500.00, through donations, fundraisers, and savings, LTFD has at this time paid the note down to a balance of \$65,000.00.
