Homemade Cranberry Sauce

- 4 cups fresh cranberries
- 1 ½ cups granulated sugar
- 1 cup water
- ½ cup orange juice
- 1 teaspoon orange zest
- ½ teaspoon vanilla extract

- > Rinse cranberries in cold water.
- > In a large sauce pan, combine cranberries, sugar, water and orange juice.
- > Heat over medium heat until boiling, stirring until sugar dissolves. Then boil an additional 10 minutes or until cranberries pop and sauce thickens.
- > Remove from heat. Stir in vanilla and orange zest. Serve warm or chilled.
- > Store in an airtight container in the refrigerator for up to 5 days.

When You See Me by Lisa Gardner – *Thrillers/Crime* – part of D.D. Warren series

FBI Special Agent Kimberly Quincy and Sergeant Detective D.D. Warren have built a task force to follow the digital bread crumbs left behind by deceased serial kidnapper Jacob Ness. When a disturbing piece of evidence is discovered in the hills of Georgia, they bring Flora Dane and true-crime savant Keith Edgar to a small town where something seems to be deeply wrong. What at first looks like a Gothic eeriness soon hardens into something much more sinister...and they discover that for all the evil Jacob committed while alive, his worst secret is still to be revealed. Quincy and DD must summon their considerable skills and experience to crack the most disturbing case of their careers' and Flora must face her own past directly in the hope of saving others.

The Dark Hours by Michael Connelly – *Crime* – A Renee Ballard and Henry Bosch Novel

There's chaos in Hollywood at the end of the New Year's Eve countdown. Working the graveyard shift, LAPD detective Renee Ballard waits out the traditional rain of lead as hundreds of revelers shoot their guns into the air. Only minutes after midnight, Ballard is called to a scene where a hardworking auto shop owner has been fatally hit by a bullet in the middle of a crowded street party.

Autopsy by Patricia Cornwell – *Thriller/Crime* – A Kay Scarpetta novel #25

Forensic pathologist Kay Scarpetta has returned to Virginia as the chief medical examiner. Finding herself the new girl in town once again after being away for many years, she's inherited an overbearing secretary and a legacy of neglect and possible corruption. Scarpetta hunts an ingenious killer who has mastered cutting edge science for the most nefarious ends.

A Gambling Man by David Baldacci – *Thriller/Crime*

Aloysius Archer, the straight-talking World War II veteran fresh out of prison is in dire need of a fresh start after a nearly fatal detour in Poca City. So Archer hops on a bus and begins the long journey out west to California, where rumor has it there is money to be made if you're hard-working, lucky, criminal – or all three.

Roofing Permit Applications can be completed and emailed to the Village Office for quicker turn around.

Inspections are completed by Robert Downing. Please call Mr. Downing to schedule regular building inspections (pre-pour, electrical, final etc.)

To schedule a boat dock inspection for membership transfer, please email the Village Office to be put on the list. Payment of \$95 must be paid prior to inspection and can be dropped off in the LSIOT or Village Offices.

All re-inspections cost \$95 and must be prepaid to the Village Office

March 2023

To all members, contractors, roofers, builders, landscapers:

As the spring season approaches, please be mindful of these items:

1. Hours of entry into Lake Tanglewood for projects are: **7:45 am -5:45 pm.**
2. **ALL PERMITTED WORK MUST BE: APPLIED FOR, APPROVED AND PAID FOR BEFORE WORK CAN BEGIN. ALSO, THE VILLAGE MUST HAVE CURRENT LIABILITY INSURANCE ON FILE.**

(all information and applications may be found at www.laketanglewood.org or in the LSIOT offices.

The permit must be visible at the project site. (inside front window or staked at the construction site)

3. **Failure to comply with permitting and/or failure to post permits may result in a fine.**
4. All permit enforcement will be overseen by the police chief.
5. **No dumping of grass, leaves or brush into the lake.**
6. Please observe all traffic rules as well as weight/load restrictions.
