### FICTION

**THE CUCKOO’S CALLING** (*Robert Galbraith*) After an injury in Afghanistan, Detective Cormoran Strike is barely scraping by as a private investigator in London when opportunity walks through the door, and he must investigate a supermodel's suicide.

**RAZOR GIRL** (*Carl Hiaasen*) When Lane Coolman's car is bashed from behind on the road to the Florida Keys, it's not an ordinary accident. Behind the wheel of the other car is Merry Mansfield—the Razor Girl—and the crash scam is only the beginning of events that involve the star of redneck reality show Bayou Brethren, a street psycho, a Miami product-liability lawyer, and a cop who was demoted after attacking his then-lover's husband with a Dust Buster.

**BEHIND CLOSED DOORS** (*B.A. Paris*) The perfect marriage? Or the perfect lie? Jack and Grace are never apart. Some might call this true love. Others might ask why Grace never answers the phone. Or can never meet for coffee although she does not work. And why there are bars on one of the bedroom windows.

**COMMONWEALTH** (*Ann Patchett*) After an unexpected romantic encounter, two marriages dissolve and two families are joined. The chance encounter reverberates through the lives of the four parents and six children over five decades. Their childhoods become the basis for a legendary novelist's wildly successful book, forcing them to come to terms with their losses, guilt, and deeply loyal connections.

**A GREAT RECKONING** (*Louise Penny*) An intricate old map is found stuffed into the walls of the bistro in Three Pines. It will lead Armand Gamache, former Chief of Homicide for the Surete du Quebec, to places even he is afraid to go, eventually leading to a dead professor at the Surete academy. ## **SOUTHWEST AMBUCS & LAKE TANGLEWOOD SERVICES**

You might not be familiar with Southwest AMBUCS; but AMBUCS and service to Lake Tanglewood (LT) go hand in hand. AMBUCS is a service organization that provides handicapped children and wounded veterans with special AMtrykes that help them with development. It also provides scholarships to physical & occupational therapy students from Texas Tech & speech pathology students from West Texas.

This past fiscal year AMBUCS gave away 104 AMtrykes valued at almost \$80,000; \$30,000 in scholarships. In June AMBUCS presented a check for \$39,000 to the Amarillo City Council to purchase the equipment for a special needs park at MediPark.

As you are aware, LTFD has become one of the best fire departments in the Texas Panhandle and have several mutual aid agreements with local Fire Departments for our services in time of need. LTFD has also provided medical care and ambulance service to Lake Tanglewood and the surrounding neighborhoods and cities for many years, however due to increased regulation costs and the shortage of licensed staffing; LTFD no longer provides licensed ambulance service. We will continue to provide First Responder Service's and have the intentions of being here for you in your time of need, whether fire or medical emergency.

Due to the loss of the ambulance income we find ourselves struggling with the cost of day to day operations and need your assistance with operations and the note on our newly/used fire engine that was obtained in November of 2015. Original cost of the used fire engine was \$145,500.00, through donations, fundraisers, and savings, LTFD has at this time paid the note down to a balance of \$65,000.00.
