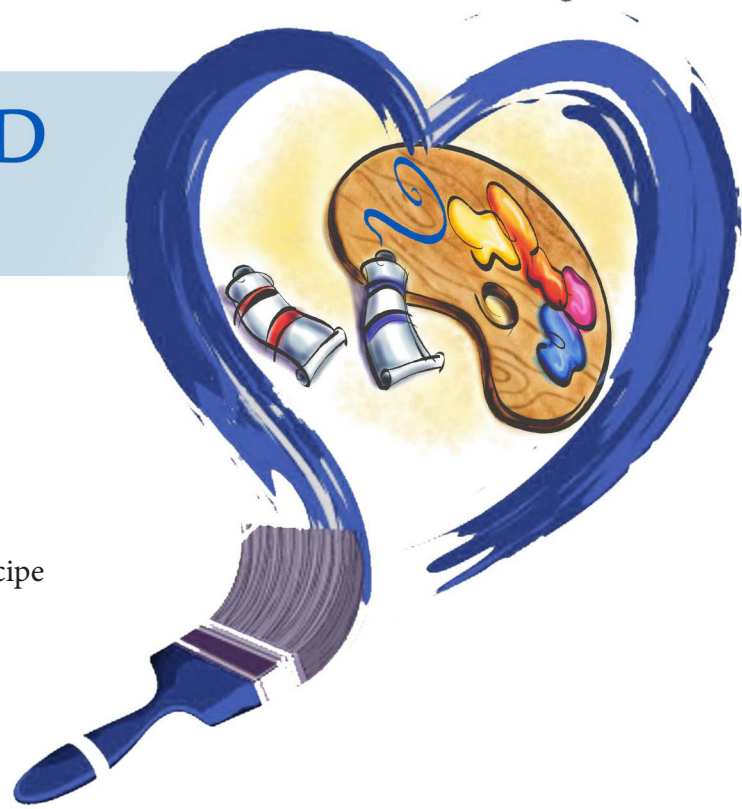

THE LATE SHOW (*Michael Connelly*) Renée Ballard works the night shift in Hollywood, beginning many investigations but finishing none as each morning she turns her cases over to day-shift detectives. A once up-and-coming detective, she's been given this beat as punishment after filing a sexual harassment complaint against a supervisor. But one night she catches two cases she doesn't want to part with.

A COLUMN OF FIRE (*Ken Follett*) Ned Willard and Margery Fitzgerald find themselves on opposing sides of the religious divide sweeping England. Ned goes to work for Princess Elizabeth, and all Europe turns against England when she becomes queen. Over a turbulent half century, the love between Ned and Margery seems doomed as extremism sparks violence from Edinburgh to Geneva.

SAME BEACH, NEXT YEAR (*Dorothea Benton Frank*) One enchanted summer, two couples begin a friendship that will last more than 20 years and transform their lives. A dazzling celebration of the power of friendship, the enduring promise of summer, and the indelible bonds of love.

Y IS FOR YESTERDAY (*Sue Grafton*) The darkest and most disturbing case report from the files of Kinsey Millhone, *Y is for Yesterday* begins in 1979, when four teenage boys from an elite private school sexually assault a fourteen-year-old classmate—and film the attack. Now, it's 1989 and one of the perpetrators, Fritz McCabe, has been released from prison. Moody, unrepentant, and angry, he is a virtual prisoner of his ever-watchful parents—until a copy of the missing tape arrives with a ransom demand. That's when the McCabes call Kinsey Millhone for help. As she is drawn into their family drama, she keeps a watchful eye on Fritz. But he's not the only one being haunted by the past. A vicious sociopath with a grudge against Millhone may be leaving traces of himself for her to find...

THE BURNING GIRL (*Clair Messud*) Julia and Cassie have been friends since nursery school. They've shared everything, including their desire to escape the stifling limitations of their birthplace, the quiet town of Royston, Massachusetts. But as the two girls enter adolescence, their paths diverge and Cassie sets out on a journey that will put her life in danger and shatter her oldest friendship.

GLASS HOUSES (*Louise Penny*) A mysterious figure appears in Three Pines one cold November day. Through rain and sleet, the figure stands unmoving, staring ahead. Inspector Gamache suspects the creature has deep roots and a dark purpose. When the figure vanishes overnight, a body is discovered. Now it falls to Gamache to discover if a debt has been paid or levied.

MRS. FLETCHER (*Tom Perrotta*) Eve Fletcher's all-too-placid life is jolted one night when she receives an anonymous text message, "U R my MILF!" Eve soon finds herself spending

hours on a porn website featuring the erotic exploits of ordinary, middle-aged women like herself. Meanwhile, Eve's son, Brendon, is discovering that his new college campus isn't receptive to his outmoded, chauvinistic ideas of sex. As the New England autumn turns cold, both mother and son find themselves enmeshed in morally fraught situations that come to a head one fateful November night.

DEADLINE (*John Sanford*) Minnesota lawman Virgil Flowers helps a friend by looking into a dognapping, and finds a team of dog nappers supplying medical labs. Meanwhile, a local school board has secretly voted to have a pesky local reporter killed.

STORM FRONT (*John Sanford*) An ancient relic is unearthed during an archaeological dig. A Minnesota college professor is keeping a secret that could change the world's history as we know it. For Virgil Flowers, the link between the two is inescapable—and his investigation, more dangerous and far-reaching than he can possibly imagine.

ONE PERFECT LIE (*Lisa Scottoline*) A handsome stranger named Chris Brennan moves into the small Pennsylvania town of Central Valley. He's applying for a job as a teacher and a varsity baseball coach at the local high school. He looks perfect on paper, but his name is an alias, his resume is false, and everything about him is a lie. And he has a secret plan—for which his needs a pawn on the baseball team.

NON FICTION

HIDDEN CHRISTAS (*Timothy Keller*) We all think we are familiar with the story of the birth of Jesus. Yet despite the abundance of Christian references in popular culture—Nativity scenes, songs about shepherds and angels—how many of us have examined the hardedges of this biblical story? A pastor takes listeners on a journey into the surprising background of the Nativity.

THE MAGNOLIA STORY (*Chip & Joanna Gaines*) *The Magnolia Story* from Chip and Joanna offers their fans a detailed look at their life together. From the very first renovation project they ever tackled together, to the project that nearly cost them everything; from the childhood memories that shaped them, to the twists and turns that led them to the life they share on the farm today.

AUDIO BOOKS

BEFORE THE FALL (*Noah Hawley*) On a foggy summer night 10 people—nine privileged, one a down-on-his-luck painter—board a private jet in Martha's Vineyard. The plane never reaches its destination, and the only survivors are a painter and a six-year-old boy, the last remaining member of a very wealthy media mogul's family. Eventually a picture begins to emerge of the mystery surrounding the crash.

THE DARK TOWER: THE GUNSLINGER (*Stephen King*) Roland of Gilead: The Last Gunslinger. He is a haunting figure, a loner on a spellbinding journey into good and evil. In his desolate world, which mirrors our own in frightening ways, Roland tracks The Man in Black, encounters an enticing woman named Alice, and begins a friendship with the boy from New York named Jake.

THE MOUNTAIN BETWEEN US (*Charles Martin*) When their plane crashes in Utah's frigid, remote mountain wilderness, Dr. Ben Payne, a gifted surgeon, and Ashley Knox, a young

magazine writer, are thrust together in a life-and-death situation. As the days turn into weeks, their physical wounds begin to heal while they are forced to confront surprising and painful truths about their lives.

A TREE GROWS IN BROOKLYN (*Betty Smith*) The American classic about young Francie Nolan—avid reader, candy connoisseur, and adroit observer of human nature—who's growing up in early 20th-century Brooklyn with her sweet but tragic Irish father and her severely realistic mother.

THE LYING GAME (*Ruth Ware*) On a cool June morning, a resident of the seemingly idyllic coastal village of Salten is walking her dog along a tidal estuary. Before she can stop him, the dog charges into the water and retrieves what first appears to be a wayward stick, but turns out to be, to her horror, a human bone. The next morning, three women in and around London—Fatima, Thea, and Isabel—receive the text they had always hoped would never come, from the fourth in their formerly inseparable clique, Kate, that says only, "I need you."

Emergency Management Notes

September 15th at 6:30 AM, a **mountain lion** was spotted in the Palisades. As our longer term residents are aware, there are a few mountain lions spotted in the Palisades and Lake Tanglewood during the year. It is just a normal part of living in an urban – wildlife transition area. It is also a reminder to be cautious about leaving pets out of doors. Both mountain lions and coyotes are native to this area as are raptors such as bald eagles in the winter and great horned owls. Additionally, fox, skunks and raccoons are known carriers of rabies.

With the above average recent rainfall, we are experiencing **above average grass and vegetation growth**. Eventually, the moisture will let up and we will enter our normal dry weather patterns. As the air dries, vegetation dries and the wildfire danger increases. **It is important to keep grass and weeds mowed, especially on undeveloped lots.**

The crude petroleum pipeline exercise scheduled for October 11th has been cancelled. The Phillips 66 personnel involved have been heavily tasked with the Harvey recovery operations.

Effective November 1, 2017, Chris Johnson will take over as the village emergency management coordinator. I ask that you give him the same cooperation and support you provided to me. I will continue to serve as an assistant EMC for a while to assist with the transition.

Warning Sirens

It looks like the long process of obtaining warning sirens for our village is finally nearing completion. If all goes well, the sirens should be installed the second week of October and operational by the end of the month.

The need for a means of alerting and warning our residents was made evident during the *no warning* evacuation as the Feb 2011 wildfire rapidly closed in on the village. During the several months the village explored its options for alerting our residents, two available systems caught our attention. These were the PARIS Alert System and warning sirens. Since the PARIS System was just being introduced in the Panhandle, the village immediately signed on and it has been part of our resident alert system for the past several years. It has taken much longer to finally obtain our warning sirens.

Because of the cost of the sirens, the village would have to receive a federal (FEMA) cost sharing grant to fund them. Additionally, it would require support from both the village and LSIOT since the village would have to pay its cost share and maintain them and LSIOT would have to authorize placement of the sirens on their property. Both boards came together and supported the requirement. During the ensuing years, the village, with considerable assistance from PRPC applied for multiple grants.

FEMA finally approved our grant and the project moved into final planning; sending out RFPs for bids; selecting a source and contracting for the sirens. Before all this could be started, both the village and LSIOT had to once again come together to support the project. The village had to approve accepting the grant and committing the funds and LSIOT had to approve the sites. Both boards voted to support the project and show what can be accomplished when they work together for the community.

Federal Signal was awarded the contract. They identified (using sophisticated computer modelling) the best locations to provide maximum coverage of the village. The modelling takes into account the village layout, topography, foliage and some other factors. Our terrain and irregular cliffs, bluffs and shoreline don't create an ideal situation. They also have to be able to communicate with the Amarillo system. Based on the projections and weather conditions, the village

should have excellent coverage. The two locations are the intersection of Lago Vista and Tanglewood and the loop at the end of South Shore.

Warning sirens aren't the primary alert and warning system. They are primarily an outdoor alerting and warning system and are a key part of multiple layers of alert. The weather radio is still the primary alert and warning system (a few locations in the village have poor or no reception). Other parts of the system are local TV and radio stations, cell phone apps and the PARIS alert system. The warning sirens, which should be audible in most locations over power tools, lawn mowers, boat motors, etc. are to get your attention to immediately check your weather radio and other sources of emergency information.

The sirens may be used for more than tornado warnings. As we are all aware, wildfires are a constant threat throughout the Panhandle. Our village has experienced at least two wildfires, with the most recent being in February 2011. Additionally, we have three hazardous material pipelines crossing our village and under the lake. There is a 10 in. high pressure natural gas pipeline and two crude petroleum pipelines having a combined capacity of transporting 5 million gallons of crude petroleum per day.

Last is the answer to the question, who will activate the sirens when needed? Since our village does not have a 24/7 Office of Emergency Management, we have entered into an agreement with the Amarillo Office of Emergency Management to incorporate our sirens in their system. Amarillo will also provide maintenance support for the sirens. The Amarillo OEM personnel will activate the sirens in accordance with their existing procedures when a tornado threatens our village and when directed by the village mayor or emergency management coordinator. We will also have the ability to activate the sirens from the village. Amarillo OEM maintenance personnel will be able to remotely monitor the maintenance status of the sirens.

We hope to never have to activate the sirens for an emergency, but they will be there if needed.
