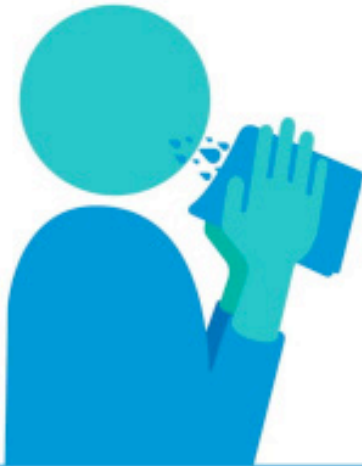

FICTION

THE LIONS OF FIFTH AVENUE by Fiona Davis - *Mystery, Historical Fiction*

The New York Public Library on Fifth Avenue and 42nd Street has captivated tourists, scholars, and employees alike for more than a century. In Fiona Davis's latest historical novel, a series of book thefts roils the iconic library, leaving two generations of strong-willed women to pick up the pieces. The novel, grounded in researched detail, transports readers between the 1910s and the 1990s.

NONFICTION

DOGTRIPPING by David Rosenfelt – *Autobiography, Memoir*

When mystery writer David Rosenfelt and his family moved from California to Maine, he thought he had prepared for everything. They had mapped the route, brought three GPSs for backup, refrigerators full of food, and volunteers for help. But traveling in three RVs with twenty-five dogs turned out to be a bigger ordeal than he anticipated. Rosenfelt recounts the adventure with humor and warmth and tells how he and his wife became passionate foster parents for rescue dogs, culminating in the creation of the Tara Foundation and placing several thousand dogs in loving families.

AUDIOBOOKS

A PRIVATE CATHEDRAL by James Lee Burke – *Mystery Fiction*

With this all-enveloping mix of horror and crime, Burke concludes a trilogy that also includes *The New Iberia Blues* (2019) and *Robicheaux* (2018). After finding himself caught up in one of Louisiana's oldest and bloodiest family rivalries, Detective Dave Robicheaux must battle the most terrifying adversary he has ever encountered: a time-traveling superhuman assassin.

THEN SHE VANISHED by T. Jefferson Parker – *Fiction, Suspense, Thriller*

The Lake Tanglewood Anglers Club and the Lions Club with LSIOT have partnered up to raise funds to do a large bass stocking for this fall. With proposed donations so far, we are looking at placing approximately 16,000 bass strategically up and down the lake; at the dam, north end and coves up and down the lake on both sides for optimum distribution. This time of the year gives the fingerlings a pretty good growing window before the onset of extreme weather sets in. We are also introducing 3000 hybrid white bass/stripers into the lake to control the numbers of shad. They do not reproduce and the last time this was done was in 2004. Our target dates are October 8 and 9, weather permitting. We will be posting info on the stockings on our facebook page and an email blast through the Office.

Building Permits

Village Ordinance requires most construction projects to obtain a building permit prior to beginning construction within Lake Tanglewood boundaries. Failure to obtain a permit may result in a substantial fine.

To obtain a Building Permit, a member must submit a Building Permit application and supplement documents (outlined in the application). Building Permit applications are available at Village Hall, Lake Tanglewood Corporation Office (LSIOT), or online at www.laketanglewood.org

Completed applications and documents may be emailed or dropped off in person to Village Hall or the LSIOT Office.

Building Permit applications must be submitted no later than noon on the Friday of the week prior to the Building Committee Meeting to be considered.

Roofing Permits can be obtained during normal business hours, with the submission of a Roofing Permit application.
