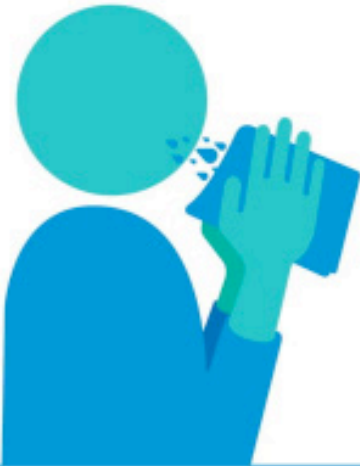


REMEMBER THE 3 C's!

FICTION

Family Jewels by Stuart Woods – *Action & Adventure* - (Stone Barrington series)

Assisting a wealthy heiress who would fend off the unwanted attentions of a tenacious man, Stone Barrington is forced to probe into his client's life to clear her name of two brutal crimes, only to discover links to a famous missing historical artifact.

Leaving Berlin by Joseph Kanon – *Thriller/Espionage*

Alex Meier, a young Jewish writer, fled the Nazis for America before the war. But the politics of his youth have now put him in the crosshairs of the McCarthy witch-hunts. A spy thriller about postwar Berlin, a city caught between political idealism and the harsh realities of Soviet occupation.

The Word is Murder by Anthony Horowitz – *Mystery & Detective* – (part of the Detective Danial Hawthorne series)

When a wealthy woman is found murdered after planning her own funeral service, disgraced police detective Daniel Hawthorne and his sidekick, author Anthony Horowitz, investigate.

The Night Window by Dean Koontz – *Fiction/Thrillers/Suspense* (finale of the Jane Hawk series)

Jane Hawk's one-woman war comes to an explosive climax as the rogue FBI agent gambles everything against a terrifying conspiracy, for vengeance, for justice, and for humanity's freedom.

Robert B. Parker's The Hangman's Sonnet by Reed Farrel Coleman – *Mystery & Detective/Hard-Boiled*

Part of the Paradise police chief Jesse Stone series. Barely holding himself together through Suitcase Simpson's wedding following the loss of his own fiancée, Jesse Stone investigates a death that may be linked to the disappearance of a recording tape by a reclusive music genius.

Where The Wind Leads by Vinn Chung – *Nonfiction* – *Religion/Christian Living/Inspiration*

The remarkable first-account of Vinh Chung and his refugee family's daring escape from communist oppression for the chance of a better life in America. It's a story of personal sacrifice, redemption, endurance against almost insurmountable odds, and what it truly means to be American. Vinh Chung now lives the American Dream.

Happiness Sold Separately by Lolly Winston – *Fiction/Women*

Discovering that she and her husband are unable to have children, Elinor Mackey finds her carefully ordered world falling apart in the wake of her husband's subsequent affair with a young mother, the woman's violent ex-boyfriend, and her own devotion to an oak tree.

The Island by Elin Hilderbrand – *Fiction/Women*

After her daughter Chess' ex-fiancée dies in a rock-climbing accident, Birdie Cousins encourages her younger daughter, Tate, and her sister, India, to join her and Chess on Tuckernuck Island for a month, a time when deep secrets are soon revealed.

The Winds of Change by Martha Grimes – *Fiction/Mystery & Detective*

Richard Jury embarks on the darkest investigation of his career when the dead body of a young London girl leads to the cold case of a missing girl in Launceston – an unsolved mystery that has haunted Cornwall Police Officer Brian Macalvie for years.

Building Permits

Village Ordinance requires most construction project to obtain a building permit prior to beginning construction within Lake Tanglewood boundaries.

To obtain a Building Permit, a member must submit a Building Permit application and supplement documents (as outlined in the application). Building Permit applications are available at Village Hall, Lake Tanglewood Corporation Office (LSIOT) or online at www.laketanglewood.org

Completed applications and documents may be emailed or dropped off in person to Village Hall or the LSIOT Office.

Building Permit applications must be submitted no later than noon the Friday prior to a Building Committee meeting (Wednesday).
