




















### **FICTION**

Long Range by C.J. Box - Crime - Part of the Joe Pickett series

Assisting an investigation into a fatal grizzly attack that is not what it seems, Joe Pickett becomes embroiled in the case of a prominent judge's wife by a would-be assassin who was shooting from a confoundingly long distance.

### Bring Me Back by B.A. Paris - Thrillers/Suspense -

A decade after his wife Layla's disappearance, Finn gets a phone call that she's been seen hiding in plain sight, receives messages from strangers who seem to know too much, and long-lost items from the past begin showing up around the house.

Robert Ludlum's The Treadstone Resurrection by Joshua Hood - Thrillers/Espionage Part One of new series, Treadstone Adam must regain the skills that Treadstone taught him – lightning reflexes and a cold conscience – in order to discover who the would-be killers are and why they have come after him now. His search will unearth secrets in the highest levels of government and pull him back into the shadowy world he worked so hard to forget.

### Mrs. Lincoln's Sisters by Jennifer Chiaverine - Family Life/Siblings - Civil War era

In May 1875, Elizabeth Todd Edwards reels from news that her younger sister Mary, former First Lady and widow of President Abraham Lincoln, has attempted suicide. Elizabeth and her three sisters must come together to help Mary in her most desperate hour. When Civil War erupted, the conflict that divided a nation shattered their family. The Todd sisters' fates were bound to their husbands' choices as some joined the Lincoln administration, others the Confederate Army.

<u>The Sweet Taste of Muscadines</u> by Pamela Terry – *Women* – Debut novel of Southern fiction appealing to fans of *Where the Crawdads Sing*. Lila and Henry return to their small southern hometown in the wake of their mother's sudden and suspicious death in the muscadine arbor behind the family estate. As facts are uncovered about her death, shocking truths are revealed that overturn the family's history as they know it – truths that will dramatically alter the course of their lives.

<u>The Lincoln Highway</u> by Amor Towles —*Historical/General* — Author of *A Gentleman From Moscow* and *Rules of Civility* In June of 1954, eighteen-year-old Emmett Watson, released after serving fifteen months for involuntary manslaughter, discovers that two friends from the work farm have hidden themselves in the trunk of the warden's car and have hatched a different plan for Emmett's future.

### The Forest of Vanishing Stars by Kristin Harmel – Historical/World War II

Raised in the unforgiving wilderness of eastern Europe after being kidnapped, a young German woman, in 1941, vows to teach a group of Jews fleeing the Nazi terror how to survive in the forest - until a secret from her past threatens everything.

### Vera by Carol Edgarian – Literary –

Narrowly surviving the 1906 San Francisco earthquake, a bordello proprietor's daughter bonds with an unlikely new family, from a Chinese clan and an orphan caregiver to tenor Enrico Caruso and tabloid celebrity Alma Spreckels.
