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Dear Members:

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Memorial weekend is upon us. Remember, if you are having a gathering at the lake to be sure and get your alphabetized list to the gate in time. A list with five to fifteen guests has to be turned in at the gate at least 24 hours before hand, more than fifteen has to be turned in at least 48 hours before the start of the function. These requirements are done to help facilitate staffing plans to handle the traffic coming through the gate. Failure to meet these deadlines may result in un-pleasantries.

Please be aware that the rules governing water activities have changed substantially for this year. No guests will be allowed to operate any powered water craft (boats and jet skis) unless a member, as defined, is on board. Further, children of members must have completed the Boater Education course if born on or after September 1, 1993. They may not operate powered watercraft without an adult member on board, unless they have passed an approved water safety class and have the certificate with them.

The board strongly recommends that each member review the new rules, which are posted on the POA's website. Please contact the office with any questions, or if further information is needed.

Looking for something to read this summer? Try downloading the updated Texas Property Code from our website. Outwardly, the Code would appear to be without plot or logical structure, but has its place if sleep is avoiding you.

FICTION

MAN CALLED OVE, by Fredrik Backman. In Sweden, a grumpy yet loveable man finds his solitary world turned on its head when a boisterous young family moves in next door. When the chatty couple with two daughters accidentally flatten Ove's mailbox, it is the beginning of a heartwarming tale of unkempt cats, unexpected friendship, and the ancient art of backing up a U-Haul.

THE LAST MILE, by David Baldacci. Convicted murderer Melvin Mars is granted a reprieve from execution for the killing of his parents 20 years ago. Another man has confessed. Amos Decker, newly hired on an FBI special task force, wonder if the confessor is telling the truth. Who wants Mars out of prison? And why now? Second in the series featuring investigator Amos Decker, the man unable to forget anything.

FOOL ME ONCE, by Harlan Coben. Former special-ops pilot Maya, home from the war, sees an unthinkable image captured by her nanny cam while she is at work. Her two-year-old daughter is playing with Maya's husband, Joe – who had been brutally murdered two weeks earlier. Maya must come to terms with deep secrets and deceit in her own past before she can face the truth about her husband – and herself.

SPEAKING IN TONGUES, by Jeffrey Deaver. A horrifying thrill ride from the author of *The Devil's Teardrop* and *The Empty Chair*. In a departure from the popular Lincoln Rhyme series, a silver-tongued prosecutor's teenage daughter disappears. The call goes out: has an evangelical preacher turned murderous?

COME RAIN OR COME SHINE, by Jane Karon. Father Tim Kavanagh's adopted son, Dooley, has graduated from vet school and opened his own animal clinic. Since money will be tight for a while, maybe he and Lace Harper, his once and future soul mate, should keep their wedding simple. Piece of cake, right?

MILLER'S VALLEY, by Anna Quindlen. In a small town on the verge of big change, a young woman unearths deep secrets about her family and unexpected truths about herself. As Mimi Miller grows up, the people in her world who have seemed forever bound begin to drift apart: her mother, her reclusive sister, her damaged brother, and townspeople menaced by the lingering presence of government officials.

ELIGIBLE, by Curtis Sittenfeld. Liz, a New York City magazine writer, and her yoga-instructor sister, Jane, return to their childhood home when their father has a health scare. Dealing with the family in disarray, they encounter handsome young doctor Chip Bingley and his neurosurgeon friend Fitzwilliam Darcy. A modern retelling of Jane Austen's classic novel *Pride and Prejudice*.

Building Permits

Village ordinance requires all construction projects to obtain a building permit prior to beginning construction within the LT boundaries. Failure to obtain a permit may result in a substantial fine.

To obtain a BUILDING PERMIT, you must submit a BUILDING PERMIT APPLICATION. Building Permit Applications are available at the Village Hall, Lake Tanglewood Corporation Office, or online at www.laketanglewood.org

BUILDING PERMIT APPLICATIONS must be submitted one week before the next Building Committee Meeting. Meetings are held on Wednesday, 5:30pm at Village Hall.

Village Notes

This month my corner will be short, but include a couple of important topics.

First, the aldermen passed an ordinance (8.013) establishing a curfew from 12:00AM until 6:00AM for those under the age of 17. There are a few exceptions, including coming home from work and returning from school activities, being accompanied by a parent or guardian and on your home property.

Second, as we get into the warmer months boating safety will become a high emphasis for our police department. They will conduct spot checks of boats and personal water craft for required safety equipment and operator certification. In addition to the unique village boating rules, our ordinances also require boaters to comply with the Texas Water Safety Act. One of these requirements is that all operators of powered boats (15hp or greater), personal watercraft and sailboats over 14 ft in length require either a TPWD issued Boater ID card or USCG issued vessel operator's license if they were born after Sept 1, 1993. You are required to have both a photo ID and the boater ID card in your possession. All of our ordinances can be found on the Lake Tanglewood website.

The TPWD website lists three approved online boater safety courses. They are:

- BoatUS, a Texas Boating NASBLA approved course.

- Boat-ed

Village of Lake Tanglewood Roofing Requirements (2016)

Permits are required for all roofing projects over 100 sq. ft. Residential roofing permits are \$50.00 with one inspection (min.) at \$125.00. (Note: new construction roofing will be included in the new home construction permit. A separate permit is not required).

Roof coverings of asphalt shingle, wood, slate, clay, cement, or asbestos cement tile shall not be installed without first removing all existing layers of roof coverings. An additional layer of those materials on top of an existing layer is not permitted: {see exceptions for complete and separate metal roofing systems in the 2015 International Residential Code}

Wood shakes and shingles shall only be used on solid sheathing.

Required Information on Building Permit Application for Roofing:

- Section I All homeowner's information.
- Section II All contractor's contact and insurance (bonding and liability) information.
- Section III State type of building (main dwelling, detached garage, shed, etc.) and type of roof material (asphalt shingle, wood, etc.). If this is the main dwelling, please indicate if there is an attached garage or any fuel-fired appliances.

Carbon Monoxide Alarms

Carbon Monoxide Alarms are required in dwellings that have attached garages or fuel-fired appliances. A minimum of one (1) CO alarm is required at each sleeping area, outside the bedroom(s). Example: a hallway common to one or more bedroom doorways is considered a sleeping area. It is possible to have a combination smoke and carbon monoxide alarm.

Approved alarms shall be installed in accordance with manufacturer's installation instructions or located on the wall at a height 42 to 90 inches above floor, avoiding locations near heating/cooling vents or areas which provide turbulent airflow, and minimum 36 inches away from openings to areas of high humidity. Avoid installing CO alarms in kitchens or above fuel-burning appliances.

In order to pass the roofing inspection, required CO alarm(s) must be installed.

The Building Committee recommends obtaining the services of a roofing contractor who is licensed with the City of Amarillo or with the City of Canyon. These contractors carry a \$20,000 bond and \$300,000 residential liability insurance.

THE RECENT RAINFALL HAS BEEN NICE; HOWEVER THE RAIN ALSO INCREASES THE MOSQUITO POPULATION. WE WILL BE PRE-TREATING AND FOGGING FOR MOSQUITOS PERIODICALLY TO HELP CONTROL THE POPULATION. AS HOMEOWNERS, YOU CAN HELP BY KEEPING GRASS MOWED DOWN, AVOID OVER WATERING THE LAWN, AND ELIMINATING SMALL POOLS OF WATER AROUND THE HOME. ALSO COMPANIES LIKE PROCHEM AND PANHANDLE GREENHOUSE OFFER SEVERAL SAFE PRODUCTS THAT CAN BE APPLIED AROUND THE HOME TO HELP WITH MOSQUITOS.

REMINDER - THE DUMP IS FOR TREE LIMBS, BRUSH, CATTAILS, AND GRASS CLIPPINGS ONLY. PLEASE **DO NOT** DUMP LUMBER, CROSS TIES, AND HOUSE HOLD TRASH.

ALSO, THE TRASH CANS AROUND THE FUEL PUMPS, PARK, AND BOAT RAMPS ARE INTENDED FOR USE IN THOSE AREAS AND **NOT** FOR PERSONAL HOUSEHOLD TRASH. THERE ARE TRASH COMPANIES AVAILABLE TO PICK UP RESIDENTIAL TRASH.
